## JANUARY 15, 2023 THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends,

In the scripture readings today we read these words from the Prophet Isaiah: "the Lord said to me, you are my servant through whom I will show my glory." Remembering that we are all created in the image and likeness of God, we commit ourselves to proclaiming and protecting the dignity of every human being.

This Monday we honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King who worked tirelessly to affirm the dignity of all people regardless of race, color or creed. January has also been a time for us to pray for a culture that respects the dignity of human life especially in light of the number of abortions that continue to happen in our world. As we pray once again for all the unborn children whose lives are cut short because of abortion, we remind ourselves that we have a long way to go in creating a culture that values the dignity of all humans beings.

Each day we are reminded how the dignity of human life is being cast aside. Pope Francis speaks often about a "throwaway culture" that easily allows people to be cast aside. If we are to create a culture that values life I believe we need to learn how to embrace the word "and." We value the millions of children who die because of abortion *and* we value the young pregnant women who see no alternative but to have an abortion. We hold with dignity all the soldiers who have served our country, especially those who suffer physically and emotionally from it *and* we hold with dignity the thousands of women and children and elderly who die as a result of bombs that are dropped or artillery shells that go astray. We stand with policemen who are trying each day to serve and protect the community *and* we stand with those who feel they don't get a fair deal in our justice system. We rightly join with those people who want to protect what they have spent a lifetime earning *and* we open our hearts to immigrant families who likewise are trying to provide the best for their families.

"*And*" is the keyword. To make our hearts big enough to do this is our challenge. That is quite a challenge in a world that wants to divide people into those who are good or bad, right or wrong. Doing this can give us a false sense of security which is probably the reason we so often do it. But it is not the Gospel. If Jesus had any preference, it was to stand with the outcast, the marginalized, the ones who are so easily discarded. If we want to proclaim the Gospel of Life, we can do no less.

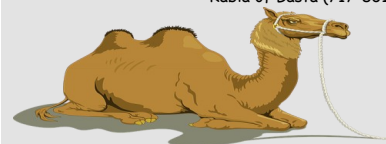

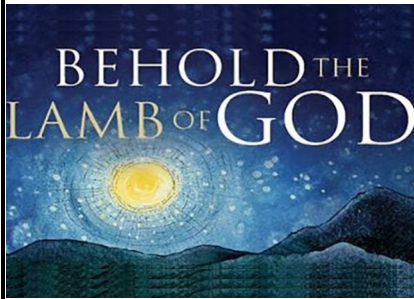


#### TRYING TO WORK IN

## CARING FOR OUR COMMON HOME



In this year of Eucharistic Renewal, we continue reading Pope Francis's teaching letter (encyclical) entitled *Laudato Si—Caring for Our Common Home* and seeing the real presence of God in all things.



With great clarity St. John Paul II explained that "the Church does defend the legitimate right to private property, but it also teaches with no less clarity that a social mortgage always weighs on every private property, so that the goods may serve the general purpose that God has given them". Therefore he affirms that "it is not according to God's plan to manage this gift in such a way that its benefits are to the advantage of only a few". This seriously questions the unjust habits of a part of humanity.

The rich and the poor have equal dignity, because "the Lord created both" (Pr 22,2), "he created the small and the great" (Wis 6,7), and "He makes his sun rise on the bad and the good" (Mt 5:45). This has practical consequences, such as those enunciated by the Bishops of Paraguay: "Every farmer has a natural right to own a reasonable piece of land, where he can establish his home, work for the support of his family and have security for his own existence. This right must be guaranteed so that its exercise is not illusory but real. This means that, in addition to the property title, the farmer must rely on technical training, loans, insurance and access to the market."



The environment is a collective good, the heritage of all humanity and everyone's responsibility. Whoever owns a part of it is only to administer it for the benefit of all. If we don't, we take on our conscience the burden of denying the existence of others. For this reason, the Bishops of New Zealand have asked themselves what the command-

ment "do not kill" means when twenty percent of the world's population consumes resources to such an extent as to steal from poor nations and future generations what they need to survive.

### THE LOOK OF JESUS

Jesus makes biblical faith in God the creator his own and highlights a fundamental fact: God is Father (cf. Mt 11:25). In the dialogues with his disciples, Jesus invited them to recognize the paternal relationship that God has with all creatures, and reminded them with moving tenderness how each of them is important in his eyes: "Five sparrows are not sold for perhaps two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten before God" (Lk 12,6). "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap, nor gather in barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them" (Mt 6:26).

The Lord could invite others to be attentive to the beauty that is in the world, because he himself was in constant contact with nature and gave it an attention full of affection and amazement. When he walked around every corner of his land, he stopped to contemplate the beauty sown by his Father, and invited the disciples to grasp a divine message in things: "Lift up your eyes and look at the fields, which are already golden for the harvest" (Jn 4.35). "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all seeds but, once it has grown, it is larger than the other plants in the garden and becomes a tree" (Mt 13: 31-32).
