## FEBRUARY 25, 2024 THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear friends,

It's been another banner week for our parish. The call went out last Sunday to take the chairs from our church back to storage and bring all the pews to the church from the storage building and more than forty people showed up to help. The job was done quickly. Monday they installed the carpet in the center aisle. Tuesday morning another group of twenty plus people showed up to install the pews. We thought it would take a couple of days to complete this work but it was done in half a day. The rest of the carpet was installed in the sanctuary. While this was going on the folks from Bradley Metal Works, with help from Zach Spaetti and his crew from Spaetti Construction installed the new handrails at the west entrance of the church.

Wednesday we put the word out to help with the preparations for our first Fish Fry. Folks were already on the job at 5 am cooking all the potatoes for our German Potato Salad. Another group came by in the afternoon to prepare all the vegetables for the fish fry. I am writing this on



Wednesday but I feel confident that the same will happen as we prepared and serve the our fish dinner. What a blessing it is to be around so many folks who care so deeply about our parish. Remember to spread the word about our second fish fry on Friday, March 8.

Our sense of caring doesn't stop with our church and our fish fry. This week I invite you to join us for a day of prayer for our brothers and sisters in Haiti. As you know, we have not been able to take folks on a mission trip to Haiti for some time because of all the unrest and difficulties going on in Haiti. For the past several weeks, the children have not been able to attend school. Not only are the children deprived of the opportunity to learn, they also don't have the chance to have a meal at school. And for so many of them, that was the only meal they had. People are hurting and having to make a go of things

in life and all the while facing challenges few of us can comprehend. Taking the time to come together in prayer in a simple way of letting our brothers and sisters in Haiti know that they are not alone.

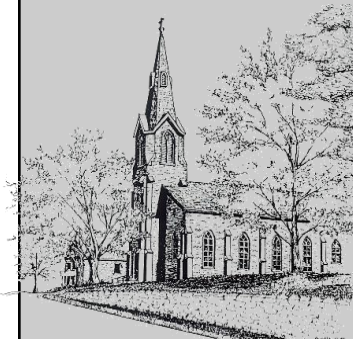

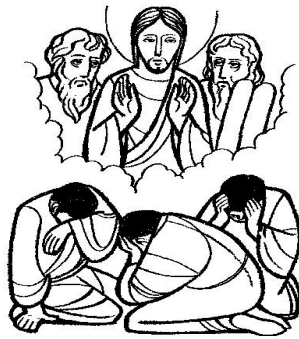

### THE TRINITY AND THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CREATURES

The Father is the ultimate source of everything, the loving and self-communicating foundation of all that exists. The Son, his reflection, through whom all things were created, united himself to this earth when he was formed in the womb of Mary. The Spirit, infinite bond of love, is intimately present at the very heart of the universe, inspiring and bringing new pathways. The world was created by the three Persons acting as a single divine principle, but each one of them performed this common work in accordance with his own personal property. Consequently, when we contemplate with wonder the universe in all its grandeur and beauty, we must praise the whole Trinity.

For Christians, believing in one God who is trinitarian communion suggests that the Trinity has left its mark on all creation. Saint Bonaventure went so far as to say that human beings, before sin, were able to see how each creature "testifies that God is three". The Franciscan saint teaches us that *each creature bears in itself a specifically Trinitarian structure*, so real that it could be readily contemplated if only the human gaze were not so partial, dark and fragile.

The divine Persons are subsistent relations, and the world, created according to the divine model, is a web of relationships.



Creatures tend towards God, and in turn it is proper to every living being to tend towards other things, so that throughout the universe we can find any number of constant and secretly interwoven relationships. This leads us not only to marvel at the

manifold connections existing among creatures, but also to discover a key to our own fulfilment. The human person grows more, matures more and is sanctified more to the extent that he or she enters into relationships, going out from themselves to live in communion with God, with others and with all creatures. In this way, they make their own that trinitarian dynamism which God imprinted in them when they were created. Everything is interconnected, and this invites us to develop a spirituality of that global solidarity which flows from the mystery of the Trinity.

### THE QUEEN OF ALL CREATION

Mary, the mother who cared for Jesus, now takes care of this wounded world with maternal affection and pain. Just as she wept for the death of Jesus with her pierced heart, she now has compassion for the suffering of the crucified poor and the creatures of this world exterminated by human power. Raised to heaven, she is the Mother and Queen of all creation. In his glorified body, together with the risen Christ, part of creation has reached the fullness of its beauty. She not only keeps in her heart the whole life of Jesus, which she "guarded" with care, but now he also understands the meaning of all things. So we can ask you to help us look at this world with more knowledgeable eyes.

We believe it is important for all those who are placing flowers on the graves of their loved ones to periodically check them. We have found that some people will place artificial flowers on the grave and then never come and check on them. In the meantime, the flowers get faded and shredded and begin to disintegrate thus causing bits of flowers to be scattered all over the cemetery. Thanks for your help in keeping our cemetery a place of honor and respect as well as a safe place for our lawn mowing crews.
