

JUNE 4, 2023 THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear friends,



I know that many of you have been anxious to learn about where things stand with the repairs to our church roof. In the June edition of The Carpenter I gave a pretty detailed report of what we are trying to do. Empire Contractors is going to be the general for the repair work. Matt Bishop oversaw the temporary repairs to the church roof last March and he will be overseeing the work as we go forward.

As I shared with you in *The Carpenter*, we have a number of things that have to be repaired and restored—things like putting a new roof on the

church and doing the necessary brick work repair to make all this happen. Other issues include repainting the interior of the church, cleaning the debris from the pipes of our church organ, fixing the west side handicapped entrance and door to the church and repairs to the louver in the church steeple that was destroyed by the tornado. As I said, we think these issues will be covered completely or at least mostly by our insurance company.

I also shared with you that there were other things we thought we needed to do to get our church is good shape for the years to come. Chief among these issues is tuck pointing the exterior brick and sealing the brick. We are also planning on installing new carpet in the church as well as putting a new coat of conversion varnish on the pews and at the same time repairing the pews and kneelers. We also have to shore up the floor joists on the west side of the church. As I said in The Carpenter, these issues will not be covered by insurance.

I am happy to tell you that the brick masons from Empire have begun doing some of the brick repair and tuck pointing of the church. This work, particularly the tuck pointing and sealing of the brick will take several months to complete. We've ordered the materials necessary to install a new roof on the church. We've got to do a lot of preparation work before they can actually put a new metal roof on the church.

In the meantime we are proceeding with the work on the pews in the church. This is where we can use volunteer help especially to move the pews to the storage building once they have been repaired. Once this is done, we can begin shoring up the floor joists along the west wall of the church. If you can help with these projects, call/text me (812-499-9074) and I'll get you hooked up with the folks who are overseeing this work. Once all this work has been done, we can begin repainting the interior of the church. And, once this has been done we can install new carpeting.

I also mentioned in The Carpenter, that we would have a capital campaign to raise the money needed to cover the things that our insurance will not cover and for the other items we want to take care of the parish. In very general terms, it looks like the total cost of doing all the things we are talking about doing is about \$1.3 million. We think our insurance company will cover about \$700,000 of this amount which means we will have to raise \$600,000 in our

capital campaign. I anticipate that we will be conducting this campaign in the next couple of month.

Please know that these numbers are a bit fluid as we are still working out the final details of some of the specific items of our project. So they may change a little. As these figures become finalized, I'll share that information with you.





CARING FOR OUR COMMON HOME



In this year of Eucharistic Renewal, we continue reading Pope Francis's teaching letter (encyclical) entitled Laudato Si-Caring for Our Common Home and seeing the real presence of God in all things.



JUSTICE BETWEEN GENERATIONS

The notion of the common good also involves future generations. The international economic crises have shown crudely the harmful effects that the disavowal of a common destiny brings with it, from which those who will come after us cannot be excluded. It is now impossible to speak of sustainable development without solidarity between generations.

When we think about the situation in which the planet is left to future generations, we enter another logic, that of the free gift we receive and communicate. If the land is given to us, we can no longer think only starting from a utilitarian crite-



rion of efficiency and productivity for individual profit. We are not talking about an optional attitude, but an essential question of justice, since the land we have received also belongs to those to come. The environment is situated in the logic of receiving. It is a loan that each generation receives and must pass on to the next generation. An integral ecology possesses such a broad vision.

What kind of world do we wish to pass on to those who will come after us, to the children who are growing up? This question is not just about the environment in isolation, because the question cannot be posed in a partial way. When we ask

ourselves about the world we want to leave, we refer above all to its general orientation, its meaning, its values. If this basic question does not pulsate in them, I do not believe that our ecological concerns can achieve important effects. But if this question is asked with courage, it leads us inexorably to other very direct questions: To what purpose do we pass from this world? For what purpose have we come in this life? For what purpose do we work and struggle? Why does this land need us? Therefore, it is no longer enough to say that we need to worry about future generations. It is necessary to realize that what is at stake is the dignity of ourselves. We are the first to be interested in transmitting a habitable planet for humanity to come after us. It is a drama for ourselves, because it calls into question the meaning of our passage on this earth. TO BE CONTINUED
