MARCH 12, 2023 THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT



Dear friends,

Wow! What a week this has been! The tragedy of our church roof being torn off as a result of the tornado that descended upon us last Friday has been overshadowed by the outpouring of love and offers of help we have received. Where do we begin. So many of our friends from

parishes throughout the diocese have reached out to us with offered of prayers and support. The school children in or neighboring parishes have been praying for us and the students of Westside Catholic even sent cookies to all our students.

Our friends from St. Paul's UCC have offered their help as did the members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. And I received numerous accounts of people in church communities far and wide who have been praying for us.

The storm had barely passed and people were already beginning to pitch in to help. Our immediate concern was whether or not to have our fish fry. But since all the food was prepared and the fish was thawed out, we thought it best to go ahead with our plans. And we served over 1000 diners!

Another group of young folks came together on Saturday morning to help move all the things we needed to be able to celebrate Mass in our multi-purpose (gym) building. They did it so well and so easily you would have thought this was a common occurrence. Special thanks to Frank and Dave Hertel for setting up the sound system and getting cameras all set up so we could continue to record the mass. Special thanks to Tom and Mary Goedde for putting signs together directing people to come to mass in our gym.

And we were able to set up a new "chapel" in the rectory for weekday mass and Eucharistic Adoration. This past week we not only had our usual Monday Adoration but we also had our 24 prayed for vocations Tuesday and Wednesday. My dog, Kiska loved it. She made several hours of adoration as well as coming to mass! More people to greet! I have to say there was something special about all the work going on in repairing the church and at the same time people in our chapel praying right next door.

Our immediate concern, after figuring out if we were going to have our fish fry, was to get some kind of temporary covering over the church to protect the inside from rain damage. Even as the winds were whipping around on Friday afternoon, we were beginning to formulate a plan to take care of things. A special word of thanks to Matt Bishop from Empire Construction for taking the lead on this. By Monday morning there was a beehive of activity going on. Trucks and cranes, excavators, mobile lifts and moveable scaffolding was being hauled in and put into place.

Empire Constriction employees Kevin Elpers, Brandon Fehrenbacher, Brad Elpers and March Elpers brought a lift on Saturday to do an initial inspection of the place. Gary Hodge from Hodge Design Service was here on Monday morning to do a structural inspection of the church and steeple. He was able to give us his opinion (church and steeple are still in good shape) the same day that it was safe for us to continue our work. That does not usually happen that fast.

Pal Nash, our insurance adjuster was on sight by Friday evening and, working with Matt, gave us the go ahead to proceed with our emergency repairs. Empire Construction, Lehman Roofing (Todd Lehman) and Electrical Maintenance Company (Ted and Tammy Glaser) shut down their other job sites so they could come and work on our project.

Mike Weber from Midwest Roofing supplied all the Ice and Watershield within 24 hours. Seth Klenck was on sight Monday morning along with Matt Koch and several other Klenck Company employees to start debris removal. Jay Sparks from Elite Insulation provided spray foam to enclose the wood beams in the church to prevent water leaks. We reached out to Allan Scott from Scott Crane Service and they were able to get a large crane here within two hours. Monday we reached out to Joe Helming who did the cooper roof on or steeple and he came by the next day to take care of some repairs. Mike Fetcher came on Saturday to take pictures of our church using a drone camera. This gave Matt Bishop some close up views of the damage and helped him formulate a plan to being our repairs.

So many folks coming forward to help. How we have been blessed! Having considered all the fact, we cannot be any other way than joyful.

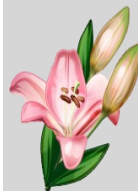

CARING FOR OUR COMMON HOME



In this year of Eucharistic Renewal, we continue reading Pope Francis's teaching letter (encyclical) entitled *Laudato Si—Caring for Our Common Home* and seeing the real presence of God in all things.



Today there has been a notable anthropocentric excess which, under another guise continues to undermine any reference to something common and any attempt to strengthen social ties. This is why the time has come to pay attention again to reality with the limits it imposes. This in turn constitutes the possibility of a healthier and more fruitful human and social development.

An inadequate presentation of Christian anthropology has ended up promoting an erroneous conception of the relationship of the human being with the world. Many times a Promethean dream of world domination has been transmitted which has given the impression that caring for nature is for the weak. Instead, the correct interpretation of the concept of the human being as lord of the universe is to understand him as a responsible administrator.

The lack of concern for measuring the damage to nature and the environmental impact of decisions is only the evident reflection of a disinterest in recognizing the message that nature carries inscribed in its own structures. When the importance of a poor person, of a human embryo, of a person with disabilities is not recognized in reality itself - to give just a few examples - it will be



difficult to hear the cries of nature itself. Everything is connected. If the human being declares himself autonomous from reality and constitutes himself absolute ruler, the very basis of his existence crumbles. Instead of carrying out his role as God's collaborator in the work of creation, man replaces God and so it ends up provoking the rebellion of nature.

This situation leads us to a permanent schizophrenia, which goes from the technocratic exaltation that does not recognize a value of its own in other beings, to the reaction of denying any particular value to the human being. But humanity cannot be ignored. There will be no new relationship with nature without a new human being. There is no ecology without an adequate anthropology.

When the human person is considered only one more being among others, which derives from a game of chance or from a physical determinism, there is a risk that the awareness of responsibility will fade in people. A deviant anthropocentrism does not necessarily have to give way to a "biocentrism", because this would imply introducing a new imbalance, which will not only not solve the problems, but will add others. A commitment to the world cannot be demanded of the human being if his peculiar capacities of knowledge, will, freedom and responsibility are not recognized and valued at the same time.

The critique of deviant anthropocentrism should not even overshadow the value of relationships between people. If the ecological crisis is an emergence or an external manifestation of the ethical, cultural and spiritual crisis of modernity, we cannot delude ourselves to restore our relationship with nature and the environment without restoring all fundamental human relationships. When Christian thought claims a particular value for the human being above other creatures, it gives space to the appreciation of every human person, and thus stimulates the recognition of the other. Openness to a "you" able to know, love and dialogue continues to be the great nobility of the human person.
