STAFF

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CALENDAR FOR THE CLASS YEAR

After registering online, parents will receive a confirmation of their payment along with a copy of the Parent Handbook and Religious Education calendar. In a separate e-mail, they will also receive a personalized welcome letter.

CLASS DAYS AND TIMES

All classes will be held on the **1st and 3rd Sundays** of every month **in Saint Andrew School**.

- **Grades K—8** begin on **September 7, 2025** and meet from **10:15 am—11:45 am**.
- **Confirmation Year 1** students begin **Nov. 2, 2025** and meet from **3 pm—5 pm**.

REGISTRATION FEE

The costs of the Religious Education Program are based on the current cost of books, shipping and other materials that students will consume during the school year. Our registration fee will remain the same this year as the prices of materials and shipping have stabilized to a degree. Please know that this is a **one-time charge** and no other fees will be requested after registration.

STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP

All students should be dropped off at the St Andrew School Cafeteria, where their catechists (teachers) will meet them, holding signs indicating the grades they teach. We cannot gather in the “Airnasium” this year due to upcoming construction restrictions.

All students must be signed out at the end of each class. Catechists will bring them to the Cafeteria and wait until each child is signed out by a parent or another adult who has been approved by a parent.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The Diocese of Venice requires parents or guardians to **submit the following three forms for each student every year:**

- Medical Authorization for a minor
- Authorization to release a minor to a third party (someone other than a parent/guardian)
- Authorization for use of student images in photos or other media, such as the parish bulletin.

These can be completed during the online registration process, or at the office upon request. *Since this is a diocesan requirement pertaining to student health and safety, students will not be allowed to attend class after the deadline below if we do not have these forms on file.*

In addition to the above forms required for every student, please note:

- ♦ **If a child is preparing for First Holy Communion, we must have a copy of their Baptism Certificate.**
- ♦ **If a child is preparing for Confirmation, we must have a copy of their Baptism Certificate and proof of their First Holy Communion which includes the date and name of the church.**

The deadline for returning all forms is Dec. 21, 2025.

MASS ATTENDANCE

Attendance at Sunday Mass is key to keeping the Third Commandment, “remember to keep holy the Sabbath.” As Catholics we fulfill this obligation by attending Mass on Saturday evenings or on Sundays. Students in the Religious Education program are expected to attend Mass weekly. Staff and Catechists do also as part of modeling a Catholic way of life for the students entrusted to our care.

While we should attend Mass out of our love for and gratitude to God, it is important to remember that as mere creatures we owe it to God for everything he has created for us and given to us. Refusing to attend Mass is a serious sin which prevents us from receiving Holy Communion until we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

There are 17 religious education classes during the school year. **We ask that students limit absences to a maximum of 4 during the year.** Four absences means that approximately 25% of all classes have been missed, which is especially difficult during a sacramental preparation year. If a student, for whatever reason, needs to miss more than 4 classes, please notify the religious education office so that homework may be assigned. That way the student will not fall behind in the class content and the reception of sacraments may be able to proceed on schedule.

PLEASE NOTE: It is impossible to schedule all religious education classes on dates that will never coincide with the **Lee County School District's breaks, which are:**

Thanksgiving Break: 11/24/25 - 11/28/25
Christmas Break: 12/22/25 - 1/5/26
Spring Break: 3/13/26 - 3/20/26
Easter Break: 4/3/26 - 4/6/26

*Please keep these dates in mind when planning attendance at religious education classes and **the required Confirmation Retreat on MARCH 28, 2026.***

ATTENDANCE IN NON-SACRAMENT YEARS

Just a reminder that there is much religious education to be had before and after sacramental preparation years. Formation in the Catholic Faith begins in the family, well before a child is old enough to participate in formal religious education. This happens when parents, the first and best catechists of their children, give authentic Christ-like example in

their words and deeds. This includes helping their children learn basic Catholic practices and prayers (see Page 8) and regularly bringing them to Mass.

Students who continuously attend religious education classes from grades K—8 receive a well-rounded education in the Catholic faith which begins with Creation and guides them through the Old and New Testaments to the present day. Our “Word of Life” program helps them to answer the question Jesus asked of his disciples: “Who do you say that I am?” Their answer will change and grow each year and will help them become the Catholic disciples we are all called to be.

PARTICIPATION & SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Religious Education classes involve much more than preparation for the sacraments. Therefore, classes are offered for all students from Grades K—12.

In accordance with the mandates of the Diocese of Venice, *a minimum of two years of participation in Religious Education is required before a student can receive either First Holy Communion or Confirmation.* We accept children from grades 1—12 into First Communion preparation, but preparation for Confirmation cannot begin until a student is in 9th grade or above

Student retreats are required before receiving First Communion and Confirmation, as are parent meetings. These dates are given on the Religious Education calendar that was e-mailed to you.

HOMEWORK

There will be 30 minutes of homework assigned after each class. Catechists will give assignments that help students to understand and practice the topics being studied. We encourage all families to assist students in completing their homework, and also to learn the basic Catholic prayers found on Page 8 of this Handbook.

Students in Year 2 of preparation for First Holy Communion must be able to read or recite the Act of Contrition, the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be before they receive First Reconciliation (Confession).

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

The Religious Education program views the catechesis of a student as a partnership between the parents and the program. Parents and students are expected to comply with the rules and policies described in this handbook, and to accept and support the authority of Religious Education staff and volunteers, whether it be during class or on social media or other public forums.

Just as a parent can withdraw a child from Religious Education, the program reserves the right to administratively withdraw a student if it determines at its discretion that the parent or student partnership with the Religious Education program is irretrievably broken. Examples may include, but are not limited to: the persistent use of abusive or vulgar language, verbal or physical threats to others, or persistent disregard for other rules in this Handbook.

CLASSROOM ATTIRE

Out of respect for themselves and for one another, we request that students do not wear any clothing that is too revealing, such as very short shorts or skirts, bare midriff tops, pajamas, swimwear, or T-shirts with suggestive or vulgar pictures, graphics, or sayings.

USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones, ear buds or any electronic devices should not be in use during class. If use persists after 2 requests to stop using the device, the device will be placed on the catechist's desk for the remainder of the class and returned at the end of class.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING

Catechists, catechist assistants, hall monitors and other Religious Education staff have been fingerprinted and vetted according to Diocese of Venice standards. All have taken Safe Environment Training to ensure that children in our care are in the safest possible environment.

In addition, all Religious Education students receive Safe Environment Training each year. This program assures that students feel safe while on campus, and that they know what to do if they do not. For more information please call the office at 239-574-2411.
