





Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time *Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10*

Making Life Miserable

If some people want to make your life miserable, they can probably succeed. Your computer can pick up a virus. Thieves can break into your home. Terrorists can gain access to public gatherings. Sometimes there is nothing you can do to stop something evil from happening.

Most enemies are anonymous and take advantage of people with a weakness they can penetrate. But other enemies are well known to us. They are people we have hurt, challenged, or offended in some way. Their reaction is completely out of line, but at least we can trace the path that explains why they do the evil they do.


Jeremiah had that kind of enemy. His prophecies took a position opposed to many of the court princes. By making people question the wisdom of their political leaders, Jeremiah was fomenting unrest. He said only what God asked him to say, but it was hugely unpopular with some people in power.

So they tried to kill him. They brought him to the edge of a large empty cistern and dropped him down on ropes into the mud. "And Jeremiah sank into the mud."

A court official appealed to the king on behalf of Jeremiah, and the king relented, giving permission for a small group to pull Jeremiah out.

If some people want to make your life miserable, they can probably succeed. But if some people want to save you, they can probably succeed too.

Feeling Overwhelmed

There are days when you most likely feel overwhelmed on account of one thing or another. It may be that you find yourself with much responsibility and are anxious about being able to properly fulfill your duties well. Or you may feel overwhelmed for the opposite reason, finding that life seems to be at a standstill and you are not sure what to do next. In these moments, of feeling overwhelmed, we must make an act of trust in God. The truth is that God could enter any situation in an instant and transform it, enabling us to face what is before us with the ease of a child. But He doesn't always do that. Sometimes He allows us to wait on Him so that the situation we face will help to purify us and urge us toward greater surrender and love. Know that God loves you and could do anything to immediately lighten your struggle. Knowing that will help you also realize that, at times, He remains at an apparent distance as an act of hidden Mercy. It's a Mercy because His wisdom is perfect and He will always act in a way that is most fruitful for your soul (See Diary #1153).

Look at your life this day and identify that which has the appearance of being your greatest struggle. How does that make you feel? If you do feel overwhelmed then pause and try to see the wisdom of God. He will never abandon you and may actually be offering you a hidden gift of Mercy through which He is calling you to greater holiness than if He immediately made your burdens light and easy.

Lord, help me to trust in You especially when I feel overwhelmed by the hardships of life. May I never doubt Your perfect love and perfect wisdom in all things. Give me the grace to see beyond that which burdens me so as to discover the hidden Mercy You offer me to purify and strengthen my soul. I thank You for all things, dear Lord. Jesus, I trust in You.

Disengagement Is Real

- 80% of young people leave the Catholic Church before age 23
- The median age for leaving the Church is just 13, though this often becomes visible at graduation
- Only 16% of Catholic young adults (18–25) attend Mass weekly
- Fewer than 1 in 5 Catholic college students engage in campus ministry without personal outreach
- Nearly 75% of youth who leave the Church say it was a gradual process—and high school is often the tipping point



The Transition Gap



HOW TO APPLY FOR A MOSCHOLARS SCHOLARSHIP

Go to **BrightFuturesFund.org**. Click on **MOScholars Program** then MOScholars **Scholarships**. Click the button for your diocese. Fill out the pre-qualification form to see if you qualify to move on to the formal application.

Qualifying Paths

To qualify, your student must meet one or more of the state designated criteria. Scholarships are verified by F. A.C.T. S, granted in order according to state rules based on available funding.

- ▶ Siblings of current MOScholars recipients
- ▶ Students with an approved IEP 'individualized education plan' developed under federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) or an individual service plan (ISP) that is developed in cooperation with a local education agency under IDEA, specifically those provisions pertaining to parentally placed private school children found in 20 U.S. Code 1412 (a) (10) and 34 CFR 300(b).*
- Attended a public school as a full time student for at least one semester during the previous twelve (12) months.
- Are eligible to begin kindergarten or first grade
- Must meet MOScholars income eligibility guidelines
