
The Book of Wisdom says the foolish see death differently than the wise do. The foolish see the death of the just as an affliction, as a complete destruction. But the wise know otherwise.

A Great, Powerful & Keen Intellect

Our minds are a gift from God and one of the two primary ways we are made in His image and likeness. The other way is through the gift of our free will. But the intellect is an incredible gift that must be given to the work of God. It is good to pray that our Lord make our minds great, powerful and keen so that we may know Him, understand Him and comprehend all the rich mysteries that He desires to reveal to us. Our minds grasp the truths of God in two primary ways. First, we must strive to engage all the many truths revealed by God through His Church. This includes the truths contained in Holy Scripture, the teachings offered by the Magisterium, the revelations from the lives of the saints and the theological discourses that seek to clarify and deepen our understanding. These precious gifts, given through the Church, reveal to us the mysteries of God. But the mind is also capable of receiving direct infusion from God. When we allow our minds to be given to God, He imparts a knowledge and wisdom directly from His own Mind. This gift offers us immediate clarity in life and discernment of His holy Will (See Diary #1474).

Reflect today upon how fully you have given your mind over to the teachings of our Lord. Reflect, first, upon whether you seek God's Truth through the Church. Do you study the Scripture and all that has been revealed through the Church? Reflect, also, upon the direct infusion of Truth that our Lord wishes to impart to you. This precious gift comes on account of His abundant Mercy so as to lead you into knowledge of His very essence and His holy Will.

Lord, my life is Yours. Today I especially surrender my intellect to You to use as You will. Teach me Your ways and reveal to me the very essence of Your eternal being. As I come to know You, dear Lord, give me the grace to follow You with all my mind and heart. Jesus, I trust in You.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Thank you to everyone who has already participated in the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA), the annual diocese wide appeal. We are aiming for increased articipation by all Catholics throughout the diocese, so if you are new to this, thank you for your consideration and for whatever you may give to this diocese wide appeal to support our Catholic Church.

November 2 every year is All Souls Day, and since November 2 falls on a Sunday, every Mass this weekend is for All Souls Day. On All Souls Day, we remember the dearly departed, most especially the Poor Souls in Purgatory.

I have a homework assignment request for everyone, but really it's a new habit is what I am asking you all to carry out, and it is connected with indulgences. The "Hail Holy Queen" prayer is a partial indulgence prayer, so it shortens the time in Purgatory partially. For one to merit any indulgences, one has to first intend as much, such as, "My Lord, I offer up this Hail Holy Queen prayer for (John Smith or whomever)."

So, first make this intention, and offer up the Hail Holy Queen prayer for "a Poor Soul in Purgatory that all they need is this Hail Holy Queen prayer to be released from Purgatory today." Now, make this a daily habit. "Hook" it with something into your morning routine that you regularly do (i.e. before you shave, before you eat breakfast, etc.). Do this daily, everyday. If you do, then think on it. Doing this prayer for this intention daily for 365 days a year, you will have helped 365 people get out of Purgatory and enter into Heaven! Now multiply that by 2 years, 3, 5, 10, 20, 30 plus years down the road. That is a ton of souls you have helped get out of Purgatory! And the best part? Those souls now in Heaven thanks to your daily "Hail Holy Queen" prayer will be praying for you and your intentions for the rest of your life. And let's say you are now dead and you are now in Purgatory. Those same souls you helped get to Heaven will now be praying for you to get out of Purgatory sooner and into Heaven sooner too.

My friends, what an amazing opportunity we have to help the Poor Souls in Purgatory with this simple prayer. What fruits and blessings may be in store for you if you carried out this simple act of prayer? I encourage you to carry this out, and see what happens as the years go by, ultimately helping countless souls enter into Heaven itself.

Sound good? If so, begin taking steps to free up your Sunday so you and your family can truly enjoy your Divine Day of Vacation on Sunday.




