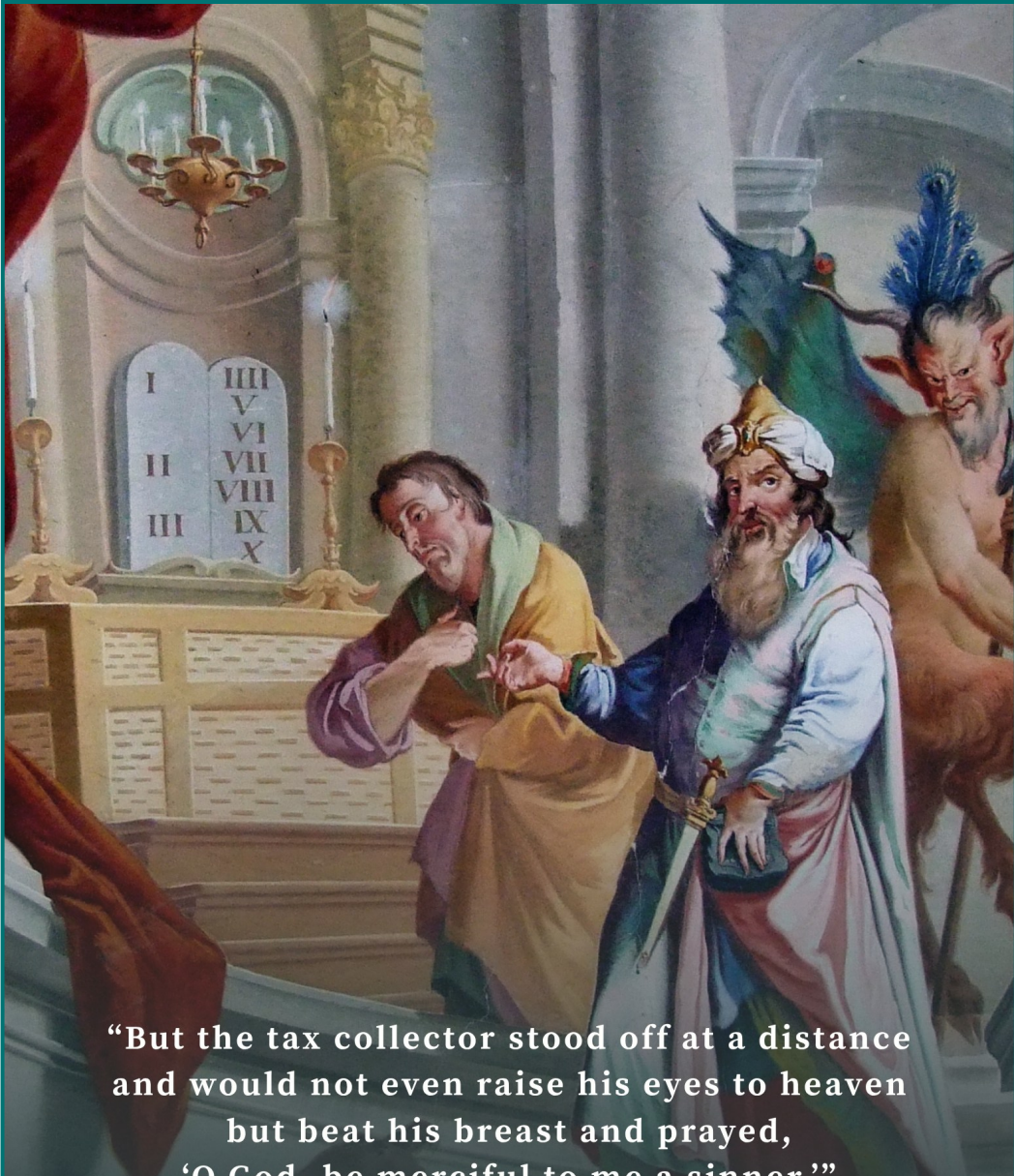

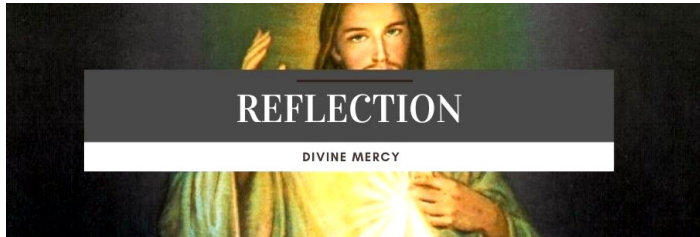

The Embrace of the Infant Jesus

It is most appropriate to prayerfully reflect upon being held in the holy arms of our God. Understanding the Merciful love of the Father in Heaven through the holy embrace of love reveals to us His fatherly care. Running to the arms of Jesus opens our hearts to His merciful love. But one image that will also be helpful and holy to reflect upon is that of the infant Jesus. Imagine if you were privileged to be present when Jesus was an infant. And imagine if this infant looked at you, reached out His arms and sought to be held by you. And imagine if this infant held you tightly as He rested on your heart. This holy exchange of love will most certainly be understood by parents as they hold their children. Contemplate the profound love and infinite Mercy of God coming to you through this warm and unconditional embrace of a little child. Jesus is reaching out to you, embrace Him and hold Him tightly (See Diary #1442).

Ponder today this beautiful and holy image. But do so by imagining that this infant burns with a holy and pure love for you and longs to be held close to your heart. Resting in your arms you feel the love of this sweet embrace. This is an image of the Love of God and a holy image. Allow your own experiences of holding a child to teach you about the Mercy of God. And express your own love for God through this holy image of a child's embrace.

My dear Lord, so small and innocent, may I hold You in my heart with an embrace of pure love. May I feel Your Heart beat with mine and Your love poured forth in this sweet embrace. I thank You, Lord, for coming into our world as an infant. May I always treasure this image and be drawn more deeply into love of You every time I hold one of Your precious children. Jesus, I trust in You.

Dear Friends in Christ,

I do have a sincere request to ask from every parishioner at both of my parishes: if you do not already, please help and contribute to the annual ACA appeal.

This weekend is the ACA annual appeal (Annual Catholic Appeal). My request in asking everyone to contribute comes from my sincere respect for our bishop and his goal in helping our diocese to grow and become more potently Catholic. He has been prudent in his slow progression in his requests from us Catholics in his diocese, and now we need to do our part as part of the diocese church.

Furthermore, **only 8% Catholics in our diocese have helped to carry this financial load in the ACA appeal for decades in our diocese.** As further background knowledge, every diocese in the USA has some form of an annual diocese wide appeal. Out of the 196 Catholic dioceses that exist in the USA, our diocese is among the lowest in the USA in its Catholics participating in their annual diocese Catholic appeal.

Let's change that, starting this year.

To answer some possible questions:

Do any of these funds go towards paying off settlements from clergy abuse cases? No, nothing from the ACA appeal goes towards paying for the clergy abuse settlements.

It's the diocese, not my parish. I only give money to my parish. A mindset I understand, yet, after discernment, a clarification needs to be lived out. We are Catholic, not congregationalists. Congregationalists is a Protestant mentality in

which my whole world of God and worship of Him is only to my local church. We do indeed have local churches which are our parishes. Being Catholic means that our world of church is the Church, the entire Catholic Church. The entire Catholic Church is composed of: my parish, my diocese, my episcopal conference (for us in the USA it's called the USCCB), missions across the world, Rome, and the Communion of Saints in the next life. That's the Catholic Church, not just my local parish. We give to our local parish mostly, and rightly so. We also give to our diocese because the diocese in turn aids our/my local parish.

What will the ACA appeal support if I gave funds? To make it personal for us all, the ACA appeal supports different offices at the diocese, and these offices support our/my parish by providing the information, aid, and assistance that is needed for our/my parish since we have a small staff that desperately needs the diocese' help. Furthermore, the ACA supports all seminarians, including our own, Weston Warner. The aid is seen in different capacities for Weston, but the largest assistance it gives is to help pay for room & board and books for Weston. As a whole, the ACA supports many other components by providing the funds for the different offices at the diocese, and it's these offices that help our/my parish. You would not believe how many times Tim Long, our parish business manager, and myself, Father Vogel, call the diocese for assistance in various areas of normal parish life, and they can provide that help only thanks to the funds given in the ACA appeal.

As a whole, we are looking for greater participation in this and all future years' ACA appeal. After prayer and discernment, let us see how our Almighty Father may desire us to participate in the ACA appeal for the sake of supporting the Catholic Church at the level above my local parish, and also so that the diocese in turn can help my local parish in its various needs too. Thank you for your consideration, your support, and God bless you all.

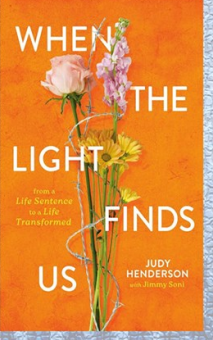

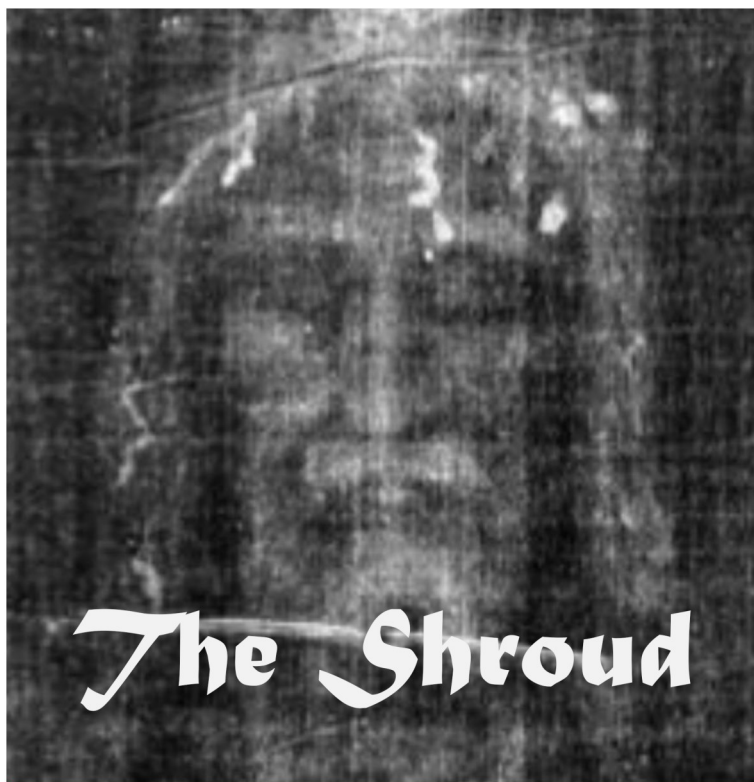

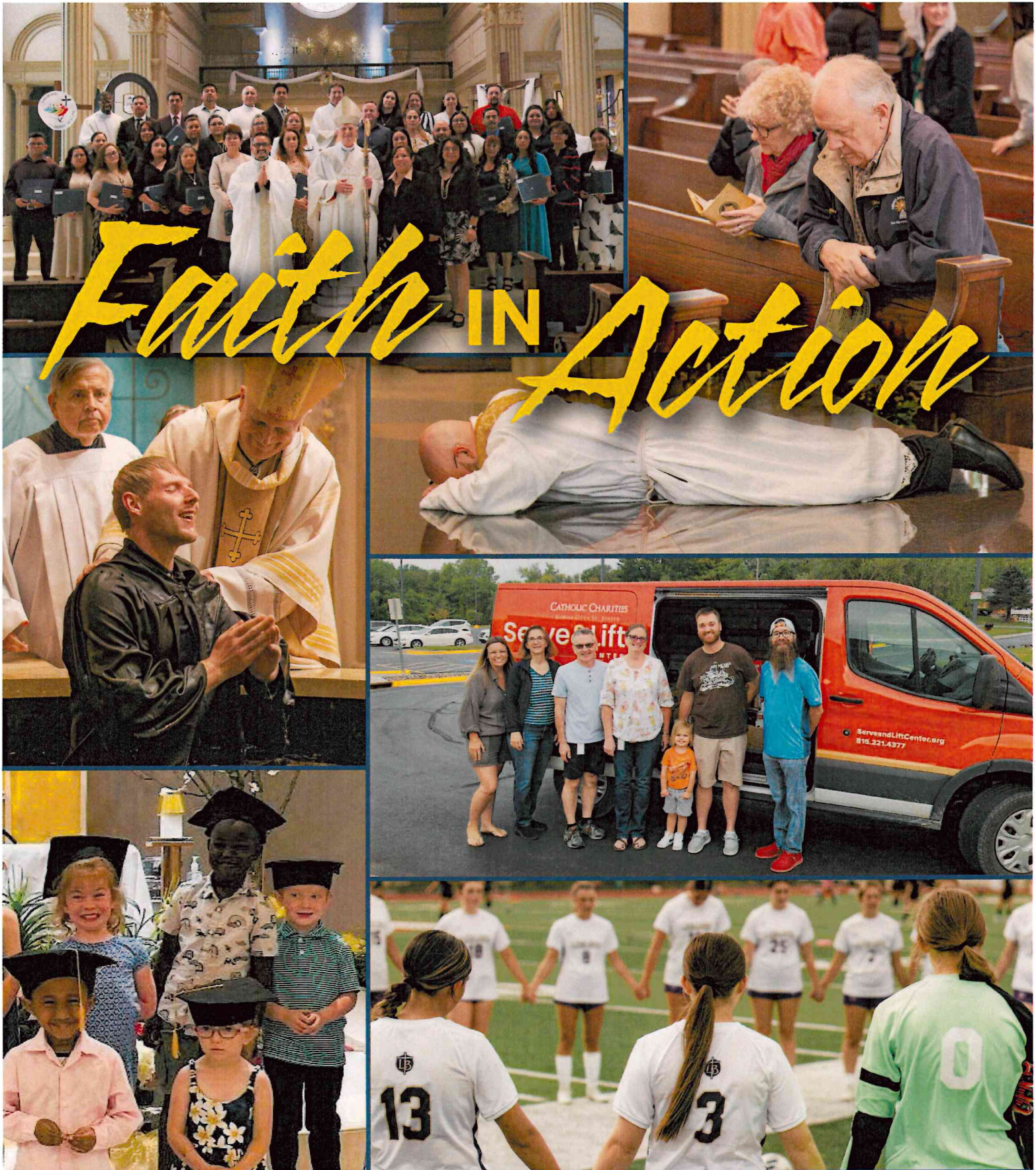
