



God has created us for a special purpose, to help announce the reign of God and bring it to fulfillment. God knows how each of us is made, what gifts we have and how they can be used for good.



Reflect upon that which you are most eager to share with others each and every day. Think about the joy you receive when you speak of the goodness and Mercy of God. Lord, help me to turn from the sensationalism and negativity of the secular world. Help me, instead, to turn my eyes to You and Your glory. Give me courage, wisdom and love so that I may speak of You freely and joyfully. Lord, You are the Good News that must be shared everywhere. Help me to be a willing instrument. Jesus, I trust in You.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we continue through the season of Lent, how would you describe your attention to specifically the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ?

Particularly as we approach the end of Lent, we focus more and more upon the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ. How we reflect on our Lord's

Passion and Death during Lent should seep over into the time outside of Lent. Not saying it will be as prominent, but it more easily comes to mind for you is what I am indicating.

So many people want to focus on just the Resurrection. The Resurrection is vitally important because without it our Faith has little substance. But the journey towards the Resurrection, which is what we call the "Passion," is just as vitally important as the Resurrection.

Examine all four Gospels. There is a lot, I mean a lot more description and information, chapters and verses on the Passion of our Lord than on the Resurrection. Furthermore, God in the Person of Jesus did not "skip" His Passion and Death and jump immediately to His Resurrection. If Jesus, Who is God, did not skip over His Passion and Death, then we most certainly should not belittle the importance of His Passion and Death by not giving it much attention.

Additionally, given that we are all sinners and that we all live in a Fallen world, suffering is just a normal part of human existence. Jesus suffered immensely in His Passion. In other words, it is thanks to His Passion and Death that we have some of the most intimate relational moments with our God in the Person of Jesus Christ. We do not have that with the Resurrection since none of us have conquered sin and death.

So, how would you describe your attention to specifically the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ? The more you dive deeply into Jesus' Passion and Death, the deeper your relationship with God will grow, guaranteed.



Catechism of the Catholic Church

“ 400 The harmony in which they had found themselves, thanks to original justice, is now destroyed: the control of the soul's spiritual faculties over the body is shattered; the union of man and woman becomes subject to tensions, their relations henceforth marked by lust and domination. Harmony with creation is broken: visible creation has become alien and hostile to man. Because of man, creation is now subject “to its bondage to decay”. Finally, the consequence explicitly foretold for this disobedience will come true: man will “return to the ground”, for out of it he was taken. Death makes its entrance into human history. ”
