



Ephesians 5:8-14

Sleep Walk

Sleep is beautiful when it comes at the right time, but embarrassing otherwise. Some people sleep through class. They sleep at meetings. They sleep during concerts. They mean well, but they miss out on important moments of life.


Other people sleep through life in other ways. They are unaware of political issues, unconcerned for the needs of the poor, ignorant of manners, aloof from people seeking their attention. Some people sleep through life, through relationships, and through faith.

Around the world, many people are unaware of Christ. It is as if they are asleep. They live in a darkness outside the light of the good news. They may have some inner sense of goodness, given as a gift from God. But they may not yet have heard the gospel, or had the opportunity to live it in faith.

Through baptism, we have been awakened from our sleep. Christ is our light. The Letter to the Ephesians says, "Brothers and sisters: You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord." Baptism has changed our status. We no longer belong to the night. We shine with the light of day.

But this has consequences: "Live as children of light." Having moved from darkness to light, we now have responsibilities. Let us shake off the sleep that threatens to keep us from being faithful to Christ. Throughout this Lent, let us rise from sleep and live in light .

DIVINE MERCY

Identifying with the Suffering Christ

Which image of Christ are you more comfortable with? Which image do you more easily identify with? The image of Christ glorified as King of all? Or the image of the beaten and suffering Christ? In the end, we will fix our eyes on the Lord in glory and majesty and this will be our delight for eternity. However, while we are pilgrims in this earthly life, the suffering Christ should dominate our mind and our affection. Why? Because it reveals the closeness of Jesus to us in our own weakness and pain. Seeing His wounds disposes us to reveal our own wounds with confidence. And seeing our own brokenness in truth and clarity helps us love our Lord more deeply. He entered into suffering through His Cross. He wants to personally enter your suffering as you gaze upon His wounds (See Diary #252).



Look at the wounds of Jesus this day. Try to call His suffering to mind throughout the day. His suffering becomes a bridge to us. A bridge that allows us to enter His divine Heart which loved to the last drop of blood.

Lord, I gaze upon You this day. I gaze upon every wound and ever scourge that You bore. Help me to draw close to You in Your pain and help me to allow You to transform my own sufferings into an instrument of divine union. Jesus, I trust in You.

Dear Friends in Christ,

We enter Laetare Sunday this weekend. This is one of the two weekends that Catholics remember because it is when priests and deacons can wear rose colored vestments. Being a comparison to the

normal violet vestment color worn during Lent, rose colored vestments show us the joy that we are now past the midway point of Lent, thus we are that much closer to Easter. It's a signal to us that the end is closer, the joy of Easter is not as far off, and thus to rejuvenate our practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving solidly to the end.

CULTURE OF SAFETY AT ST. BRIDGET

We have formed a *Culture of Safety Committee* at St. Bridget Parish with the intention of preparing a comprehensive safety plan that will address a variety of areas of concern such as Medical, Weather, Fire, Active Intruder, safe environment, and other challenges that we might encounter. To that end and as a first step, the committee has recommended that we begin with the most basic of safety measures, **locking doors during Mass**. Once Mass starts, we will lock ALL entry doors. We will have personnel available to greet you and allow entry if you're running a few minutes late. No access from the lower level will be granted once Mass starts, so all entries must be via the front doors of church.

We will implement this process beginning with Masses the weekend following Easter. Beginning Saturday and Sunday April 11-12.

This is a proactive measure and we believe in the interest of everyone's safety and peace of mind. If you have questions of concerns, please don't hesitate to contact Tim Long in the parish office.
