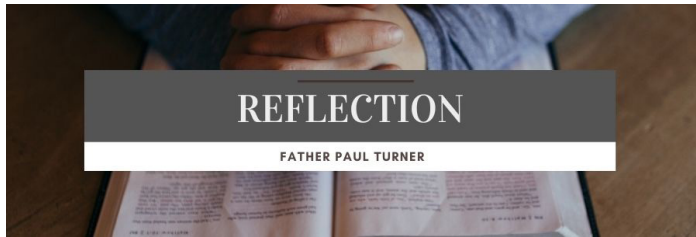

1 Peter 3:15-18

#### Meaningful Suffering

Suffering is easier to accept if it serves some purpose. Some suffering seems totally senseless—the loss of an innocent life, the abandonment of a good dream, or devastation by forces of nature. But if suffering can bring about some perceivable good, it is easier to endure.

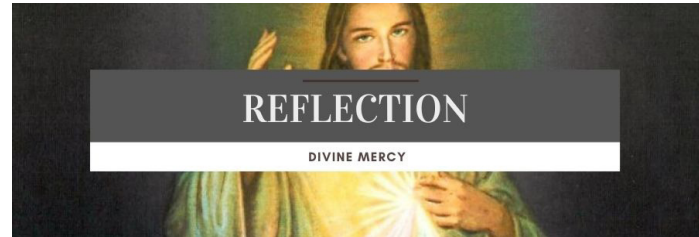
Perhaps this is what gave Jesus strength to endure the suffering at the end of his life. To unbelievers, his death must have seemed a complete waste, but in the eyes of God it was a perfect sacrifice offering redemption to the world. The First Letter of Peter says that Christ suffered for sins once, “that he might lead you to God.” His suffering had a purpose.

Through the suffering of Christ we come closer to God. Through faith in God we can more easily accept our suffering for the sake of others, especially if it leads them also to Christ.

Sometimes, paradoxically, it is our faith that brings on suffering. We have hope when the world prefers despair. We act gently when others prefer to fight. We build up others when they prefer to defame. The tension between doing good and doing evil tempts the Christian to sin. But when we are strong in faith, we live peacefully in the Spirit.

The journey of faith may be marred by suffering, but it leads to a good reward. It unites us with the suffering of our savior, and it leads others to Christ.

### Filial Fear – The Good Fear

Do you have fear in your life? It’s important to know that some fear is quite unhealthy, stemming from a form of pride, while another form of fear is quite healthy, resulting from your profound love of God. The “holy fear” is filial fear, which is the fear of a child of God. This particular form of fear is present when your love of God is so deep that you fear doing anything that would harm your relationship with Him. It’s not that you are afraid of God, rather, you have a holy desire to avoid all sin. This form of holy fear must also enter into every relationship of love you have for others. You should deeply desire to avoid all that harms each and every relationship you have been blessed to receive. This is a gift of God’s abundant Mercy (See Diary #610).

Consider your love of God. Is it strong enough to produce the healthy desire in your heart to avoid all that might hurt that relationship? This holy fear must become a driving force to develop a profoundly personal relationship with our Lord. Consider, also, your relationship with others. Do you have a healthy desire to eliminate anything that is an obstacle to your wholehearted love of them? Seek this gift of God’s Mercy and the Lord will draw you closer to Himself and to others.

*Lord, I do love You and I desire to surrender to You everything in my life that keeps me from loving You with my whole heart. Give me a holy fear so that I may draw closer to You and learn to love others as You love them. Jesus, I trust in You.*

The 9th & 10th Commandment

Covetousness is a condition of the heart that provokes words and actions that harm others and damage relationships. Healthy desires are made possible by God's desire for us to live fulfilling lives and to serve one another. Coveting is when our desires become disordered, focused on pleasing or promoting oneself at the detriment of others.

The symptoms of coveting include jealousy, lust, discontentment, being sad at the good fortunes of others or being happy about their bad fortunes. Being aware of these symptoms gives us the opportunity to examine why our feelings are disordered, and then take corrective steps to reorder our desires by replacing selfishness with gratitude, generosity, and genuine concern for others.


