**‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did
for one of these least brothers of mine,
you did for me.’**

**Then he will say to those on his left, ‘Depart from me,
you accursed, into the eternal fire
prepared for the devil and his angels.**

**For I was hungry and you gave me no food,
I was thirsty and you gave me no drink,
a stranger and you gave me no welcome,
naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison,
and you did not care for me.’**

**Then they will answer and say, ‘Lord,

and not minister to your needs?’**

He asked them, “What are you discussing as you walk along?”

They stopped, looking downcast.

One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, “Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?”

And he replied to them, “What sort of things?”

They said to him, “The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over

to a sentence of death and crucified him.

But we were hoping
