CROSS CATHOLIC OUTREACH "BOX OF JOY": **Did you know?** Last year, through the efforts of 476 participating Catholic parishes, schools and groups across 48 states, Cross Catholic Outreach collected and delivered gift-filled Boxes of Joy to 46,360 children in Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Nicaragua and Guatemala. El Salvador will be added this year, and the ministry's goal is to reach at least 70,000 kids. Catholic parishes, schools and groups nationwide organize Boxes of Joy by packing the boxes with small gifts like toys and school supplies, and adding essentials like soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes, as well as a few treats like hard candy and coloring books. Participants include \$9 (No Cash) in each box to cover shipment from the local drop-off center to the child. Boxes are due next weekend, November 10-11.

GENERAL ELECTION is November 6. In their statement on [Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship](#), the U.S. Catholic bishops lift up various issues of different moral weight and urgency. Issues include: addressing abortion, euthanasia, the use of the death penalty and imprudent resort to war; helping families and children overcome poverty; protecting the fundamental understanding of marriage as the life-long and faithful union of one man and one woman; achieving comprehensive immigration reform; providing healthcare while respecting human life, human dignity and religious freedom; establishing and complying with moral limits on the use of military force.

CROSS CATHOLIC OUTREACH: Father Pascal Kumanda of Cross Catholic Outreach, will be visiting our parish next weekend to speak at all the Masses on behalf of the poor in developing countries. Cross Catholic Outreach was founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America and the priests and nuns working in the Church overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, Central and South America.
