The Red Scarf Project officials, with the help of the Department of Public Health and Human Services and Reach Higher Montana will be delivering these scarves to support Montana's youth in foster care pursuing postsecondary education. DPHHS Director, Charlie Breton said the project is a way to brighten the students' day, "We want them to know how proud we are of them as they diligently work to pursue their educational goals. The Department stands ready to assist and support them any way we can."

Extra scarves are distributed to youth in the foster care system.

"The care packages are one way to show our continued support for Montana's youth" says Rhonda Safford of Reach Higher Montana. "Over the years we've heard back from previous participants about how much it means to them to receive a package, and we're excited to continue the tradition."


March for Life


DATES TO REMEMBER!
