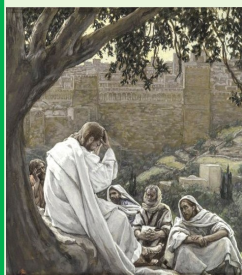

LIAM'S WISH BAGS: St. Therese Circle will be collecting items for Liam's Bags. Liam McWilliams was diagnosed with Acute Leukemia in January of 2010. As he traveled for his treatments in Billings and Denver, he was astounded by the number of homeless people that were living on the streets and how evident it was that they had very little. Liam composed a list of items that he thought would help them out and went out and bought them and put them in a bag so that when the need arose, he could give it to someone in need. After his death in 2011, the project has continued to grow with family members in three states making up bags and getting them to those in need around Christmas time. Currently, bags are given to students in need at CCDHS and the Soup Kitchen. Personal care items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, bar shampoo, men's & women's body wash, warm winter hats and gloves, socks and sweats, warm blankets, small throws, bath towels and washcloths, nonperishable food items (chewy granola bars, canned or boxed food, cereal bars, snacks), are items that are given in Liam's Wish Bags. Any of these items that would be donated are truly appreciated and are given in memory of Liam's Wish to give to those less fortunate. **Items are due Sunday, December 7th** and can be left in the baskets in the entryway of the church. 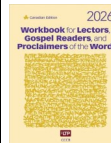
