SAINTS AND FEAST DAYS OF THE WEEK: Monday—St.

Leo the Great, pope & doctor of the Church (d.c.461), his significant contributions as Pope Leo I, including persuading Attila the Hun to retreat from Rome, defining the orthodox Christian doctrine on the two natures of Christ, and strengthening the authority of the papacy. Also, known for his theological writings, pastoral leadership, and courageous diplomacy during a turbulent time in the Roman Empire.

Tuesday—St. Martin of Tours, (316-397), founded the first monastery in Gaul, France; **Wednesday**—St. Josaphat, bishop & martyr (1580-1623), worked for the union of the Ukranian Church with Rome and was the first Eastern saint to be formally canonized; **Thursday**—St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, virgin (1850-1917), founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, traveled to the U.S. at the request of Pope Leo XIII to work with Italian immigrants, and became the first American Citizen to be canonized; **Saturday**—St. Albert the Great, bishop & doctor of the Church (c.1200-1280), born in Germany and call ed "the Great" for his intellectual gifts.
