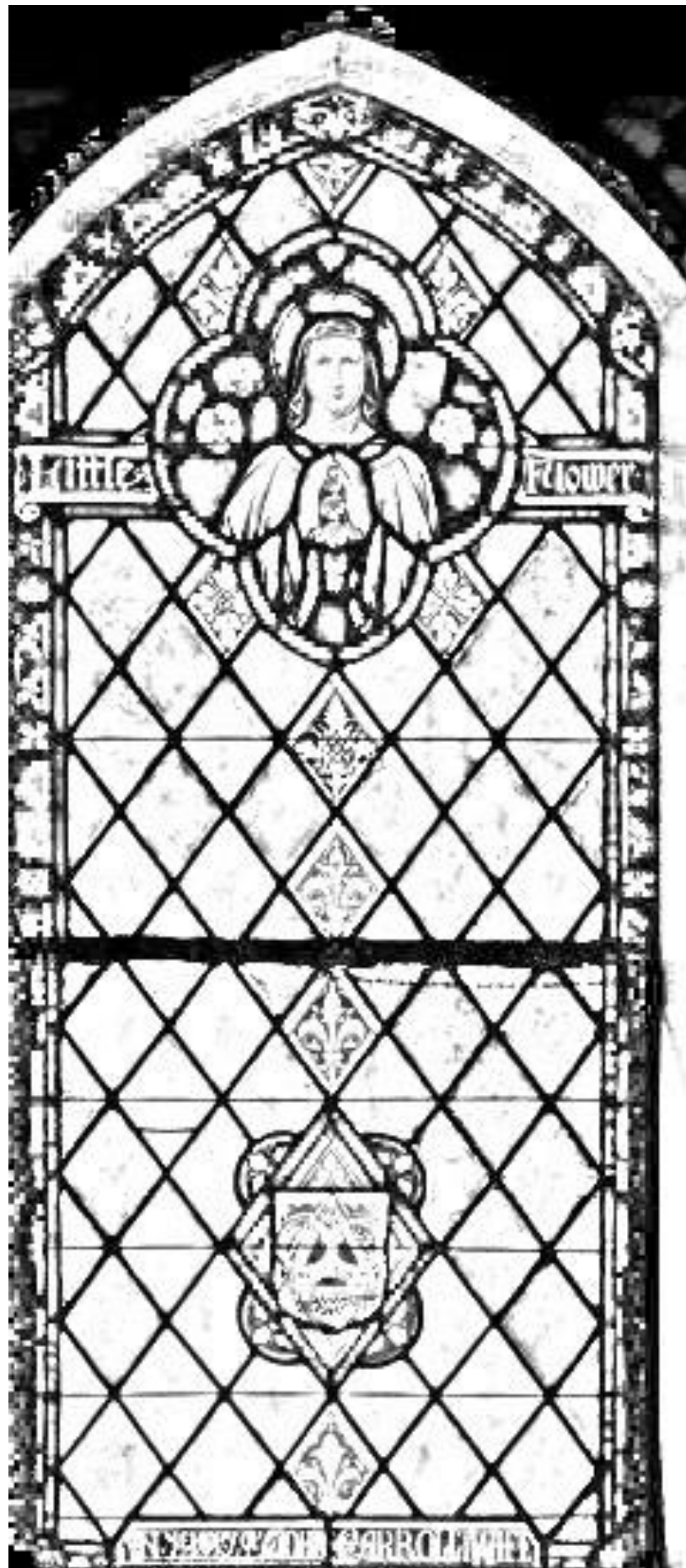


St. Therese
