“Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. “Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, ‘O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.’ But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, ‘O God, be merciful to me a sinner.’ I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.” Luke 18:9-14

Reconciliation in the Pastoral Priority Plan was expressed in this way:

“As God has reconciled us through Jesus Christ, so we will promote forgiveness and healing within families; within and between communities; among racial groups; with the Church. We will invite others to experience the good news of God’s love through an encounter with Jesus Christ.”

When we choose to look for ways to be a reconciling community of believers, it is then that the Kingdom of God is made more present; it is then that Christ’s merciful love comes alive; it is then that we are most authentic in the Christian way of life.

For our personal reflection on the reconciliation, from the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, chapter 9, as we prepare to respond to it as a parish and as a diocese.

1. How do I personally define reconciliation? How do I personally define unity?
2. What are signs that reconciliation exists? What are marks of unity? Marks of disunity?
3. With whom do I need to be reconciled with in my own life? In my family? In extended family? In the parish community?
4. Where is reconciliation and unity strong? In my own life? In my family? In extended family? In the parish community?
5. Do I find the process of reconciliation difficult? If so, why?
6. How does Jesus want me to become more involved in the ministry of reconciliation?

I invite you to read; Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs # 1420-1484. Many of us thinks of this Sacrament as outdated and perhaps not necessary. Some of us believe that our sins are only between God and the individual. What does the scripture say about it and where is the wisdom of the Church in this sacrament? You can find answers in the CCC #1420-1484.

Collect – The priest now refocuses our attention on what we are doing when he says, “let us pray.” The whole Mass is a prayer addressed to God the Father. We recognize Christ’s presence, through whom we address our needs to the Father. The invocation to pray is followed by silence. We are invited to call to mind our intention for this Mass. All the people’s intentions are collected in the voice of Christ who prays to God the Father for his Church in the person of the priest. This is why this prayer is called the Collect. There are many different forms of the collect for different days. As we listen carefully and join ourselves to this opening prayer, we will hear the common intention for the Mass for that day. We also must be mindful that this is not just the priest’s prayer. While the priest is the one saying the prayer, the prayer belongs to all of us. The whole Body of Christ is praying to God the Father with Jesus. Listen to the pronouns being used – we, our, us. Our “Amen” spoken at the end of this prayer is our vocal acceptance of what has been lifted up to the God the Father. In our Amen we say, “yes”, “I agree.” The Amen should be intentional like our attentive listening.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of November 3, our diocese will take up a collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA.

Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is responsible for providing the full range of pastoral ministries available in other U.S. dioceses to those in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations.

All told, the AMS and its endorsed priests and deacons are responsible for pastoral care of approximately 1.8 million Catholics, who hail from all 50 States and U.S. Territories, including members of our parishes.

While the salaries and retirement of military and VA chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services vital to the mission and ministry of the AMS, including Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal and Veterans Affairs.

Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to fund an annual operating budget of \$8.2 million to support its programs and services. Every three years, the dioceses of the United States are asked to take up a collection to help with this important ministry. The funds have made possible several new and important initiatives, including the first-ever Catholic military marriage enrichment retreat and widespread certification of catechists at their installations; the start of an endowment to eventually assure a self-sustaining source of funding and continued support for the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program which provides priests to serve in dioceses across the U.S. and to serve as full-time Catholic military chaplains.

Please help the AMS continue to provide priests for the Church and the military chaplaincy and to ministry to the Catholic men and women, and their families, who are part of this global Archdiocese with a donation to the **2019 Triennial National Collection for the AMS**. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity.

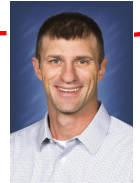
