"Do not conform yourselves to this age"

Rom 12:2a

Several years ago, we got rid of satellite TV. What came as somewhat of a surprise to me was how much more peaceful I felt, how much more joy I experienced. I no longer was hearing repeated news stories and the slants on how it was reported. I no longer was exposed to as much of the agendas portrayed in TV shows. I have become a bit less angry. As Jesus tells Peter in the gospel reading "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." By making this change in my life, I feel like I have become less of an obstacle to the work of Jesus in the world.

In the first reading, Jeremiah writes "You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped." Jeremiah was prophet. He longed for easy and pleasing messages to prophesy. But instead, the Lord compels him to announce violence and destruction. He declares to these "bullies", if they persist in their behavior, their homes and land will be destroyed, and they hate him for it. In many ways, it feels like that is what is happening today. We hear about churches being damaged or destroyed. There are attacks against the Catholic Church and what the Church teaches. Statues of Saints who fought for the poor and disenfranchised are torn down. When we state our opinion or thought on a subject, we are subject to being called names and condemned. What are we to do?

As Paul writes in the Letter to the Romans, "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." In other words, we are to persist in doing what God wants us to do, and not what the world says. We are to continue to spread the good news, the teachings of Jesus Christ. We are to follow his example and tell people what they need to hear, and not want they want to hear. This can be difficult and is hard work. But we are not on our own, as we hear in the Responsorial Psalm, "You are my help, and in the shadow of your wings I shout for joy. My soul clings fast to you; your right hand upholds me."

Is there something "of the world" that you are clinging to in your life? Is there something you need to give up? By detaching ourselves from worldly things, it provides opportunities for us to being open to hearing what God wants us to do. And when we do what God wants, even when it is hard, it can transform us; it can bring us peace and joy that only God can provide.


