# "Brothers and sisters: Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing."

It is important to keep in mind that to remain healthy in our physical body we keep nourishing it with proper foods and in proper amount. It is also recommended that we do not eat only one kind of food but that has variety to it. For the nourishment of our souls, we are encouraged to practice our sacraments, different kinds of prayers. All this to keep our souls healthy and in joyful spirt. If both the spirit and our body are healthy, we have a very good chance to become happy and intentional disciples. To grow in the joy of life the church provides for us some assistance as well, like the sacrament of reconciliation. Today the Church celebrates the third Sunday of Advent, also called the Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means to rejoice, to be happy and encourages all to be ready to celebrate; for the promise of God is about to be fulfilled. For the past two weeks. the readings have been drawing our attention to the birth of Emmanuel. Today John calls and tells us that he is almost here. But at the same time John reminds us that we do not have much time left to appropriately prepare for this special day when our Messiah will become one of us. Isn't this a joyful message - a message which calls us to be "on fire" for the Lord?

In the second part of today's Gospel passage John said that the Messiah would "baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire." Fire in biblical times was associated with God and with his action in the world and in the lives of his people. God sometimes manifested his presence by use of fire, such as the burning bush which was not consumed when God spoke to Moses (Exodus 3:2). The image of fire was also used to symbolize God's glory (Ezekiel 1:4, 13), his protective presence (2 Kings 6:17), his holiness (Deut. 4:24), his righteous judgment (Zechariah 13:9), and his wrath against sin (Isaiah 66:15-16)". To be joyful means to give hope to those around us for a gentle smile and laughter help melt the coldness of our life, just like a fire warms the coldness of the air and helps to transform even the hardest steel into and piece of art and beauty. In the New Testament, the image of fire is also used of the Holy Spirit who comes to cleanse us from sin and make us holy (Matt. 3:11 and Acts 2:3). "God's fire both purifies us of sin, and it inspires in us a reverent fear of God and of his word. And it increases our desire for holiness and for the joy of meeting the Lord when he comes again. Do you want to be on fire for God and for the return of the Lord Jesus when he comes in his glory? Our baptism in Jesus Christ by water and the Spirit results in a new birth and entry into God's kingdom as his beloved sons and daughters (John 3:5). Jesus is ready to give us the fire of his Spirit that we may radiate the joy of the gospel to a world in desperate need of God's light and truth. The word of God has power to change and transform our lives that we may be lights pointing others to Christ. Like John the Baptist, we too are called to give testimony to the light and truth of Jesus Christ. Do you point others to Christ in the way you live, and act, and speak?" (www.rc.net)

Let us then rejoice and be merry, for the Lord is near, be not afraid to be the fire that brings warmth to the world and melts the hardness of our hearts. Be "on fire" for and with our Savior.

## The Third Sunday of Advent



"Rejoice: The Lord is nigh." Christmas As draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means

for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead them into His kingdom. The oftrepeated Veni ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament. Today is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice". Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath.
