The Knight of Columbus is a Catholic fraternal service organization founded on the principles of charity, unity, and fraternity. The Knights of Columbus was established in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney in New Haven, Connecticut along with a group of his parishioners. Their intent was to bring financial aid and assistance to the sick, disabled and needy members and their families.

The Knights of Columbus has grown from several members in one council to 15,900 councils and 1.9 million members throughout the United States and around the world. The council here at Our Lady of the Black Hills (#7079) was chartered in 2006. During the last 14 years we have grown from a small council of about 30 men to 125 members. Thru your donations we have been able to support seminarians, the Piedmont Valley Food Pantry, people with intellectual disabilities, purchase 2 ultrasound machines, sponsored free throw shootouts and soccer challenges along with helping numerous people in need. We have accomplished this and more thru your support of our pancake breakfasts and bake sales, Lenten fish fry's, tootsie roll drives, Knights on Bikes events and various raffle ticket sales.

Since 1882, membership in the Knights of Columbus has been open to men 18 years of age or older who are "practical" (that is, practicing) Catholics in union with the Holy See. In the past a man joined the Knights by participating in a secret ceremony known as the 1<sup>st</sup> degree exemplification. The man then progressed to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, then the 3<sup>rd</sup>, and finally the 4<sup>th</sup> degree with each teaching a valuable lesson about our order. At the State Deputy meeting in November 2019, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson announced a historic moment for our Order — **the introduction of a new and groundbreaking combined exemplification ceremony, highlighting the principles of charity, unity and fraternity.**

"Instead of having **separate** ceremonies, all three degrees can now be conferred in a **single** ceremony. The new exemplification focuses on the history and principles of our Order. It presents a fuller and richer understanding of who we are, what we stand for and what we are called to be. It hearkens back to the simple ceremonies of Unity and Charity first approved by Father McGivney. Our new ceremony can be held in a council chamber or **in the parish with families and friends seated in the pews.** They will see firsthand, the organization that their husbands, fathers, brothers, sons and friends are joining — the principles and values they are committing to and why it matters." **Secrecy of this ceremonial is no longer required.**

Today, I am inviting you to participate or view the first pubic, "**Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity**" here at Our Lady of the Black Hills on Sunday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> starting at 9:10am. The degree lasts about 30 minutes. All members who have only taken the 1<sup>st</sup> degree are welcome to participate and advance to the 3<sup>rd</sup> degree of the order.

I encourage all eligible Catholic men to consider this opportunity to join our Order and all of its benefits, with the support of your family and friends. For more information please contact me.

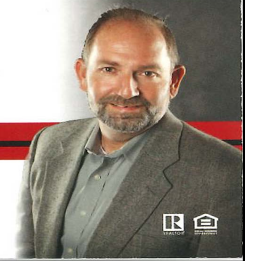
