

## "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth."

(Is 49:6)

### Contemplation from Kelly<sup>1</sup>

Today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah is called the Song of the Suffering Servant. It has been fulfilled by Jesus who is the suffering servant. As Jesus said of himself, he came to serve, not to be served (Mt 20:28). He brought salvation to all the nations by his suffering and death. This is why John the Baptist in the gospel likens Jesus to a lamb led to the slaughter: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29)—that is, Jesus, by his suffering and death freely and humbly accepted. In the second reading, Paul applies all of this to the Christians

of his time at Corinth by declaring that they have all been called and consecrated to the same mission, to the same task, as Jesus himself: to be a holy people in Christ Jesus; to be a light to the

nations so that God's salvation might reach to the ends of the earth.

Just as Paul applied the Scriptures to the people of his own times, so we must apply them to our own time—and there is no doubt that one of the most appropriate applications of today's Scriptures is to Martin Luther King Jr., whose birthday we celebrate on Monday. He certainly is one of the clearest contemporary examples of one who was called and consecrated to the same mission as Jesus. He was convinced that he had been called by God to commit himself completely to work against racism and segregation and to work for civil rights and social justice—and he single-mindedly did this as one who suffered in the service of his people. He was arrested and jailed and vilified and finally died on their behalf. He was indeed a contemporary suffering servant. He was truly a light that went far beyond our own national borders; he was a light to the nations, known literally to the ends of the earth.

In this context of seeing Martin Luther King as a modern fulfillment of today's Scriptures, what might these same Scriptures be saying to us—to all of us—about our contemporary call and consecration as Christians of our own time? Perhaps the answer to this question can be found in these strong, straightforward words of St. John Paul II to which we must give serious consideration over and over again. In his 1991 address to the Holy See's diplomatic corps, the pope said:

"The 'needs of humanity' today require that we proceed resolutely towards outlawing war completely and come to cultivate peace as a supreme good to which all programs and all strategies must be subordinated."

Is this not what Martin Luther King preached and practiced in his campaign of absolute nonviolence? He wrote so powerfully in his autobiography:

"Nonviolence in the truest sense is not a strategy that one uses simply because it is expedient at the moment. Nonviolence is ultimately a way of life that people live by because of the sheer morality of its claim."

Is this not perhaps something very specific to which we are being called in this current age? Is this not perhaps what the modern Christian conscience is slowly coming to hear: a call, a consecration, a commitment to a positive pacifism that abhors all division and war an active nonviolence that bespeaks only unity and peace? Indeed, the example of Martin Luther King clearly shows us that Scripture still speaks to our contemporary society today.


