"Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus."

(Jn 11:5)

Catholics have many beautiful opportunities to experience the love of Jesus in a communal way—most especially through the sacraments, that are first and foremost expressions of God's love for us. However, during this period of "social distancing," our communal way of experiencing God's love through the sacraments is greatly restricted. But Jesus also calls us to a personal, intimate relationship with him—a relationship of faithfulness and love in the everyday of our lives.

Today's Gospel reading is one of the few in which the personal love of Jesus is expressed explicitly and by name: "Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus" (Jn 11:5). The depth of his love for this family is most profoundly witnessed by the tears that he shed with them and for them. Even though he knew that Lazarus' illness was not to end in death "but that the Son of God may be glorified through it" (Jn 11:4), Jesus was truly pierced by the pain of those he loved so dearly. As the Jews said, "See how he loved him" (Jn 11:36).

Although this reading may be the exception in the gospels, it is really the rule in Jesus' love for us. Through the waters of Baptism, he personally called each of us by name—he poured out his Spirit upon you and me so that his love might dwell within each one of us. How much more personal and intimate can love get?

And just as Jesus showed his love for the family of Lazarus, they give us an example of how to live in a personal relationship with Christ. First of all, Martha and Mary didn't hesitate to call upon the Lord: "Master, the one you love is ill" (Jn 11:3). They trusted in his love and his friendship and called out in their need, even before Lazarus died. When crises arise in your life, who do you call upon? Is prayer your first or your last resort?

Secondly, Martha and Mary remained faithful to the love and friendship of Jesus. When his arrival was delayed, they still kept the faith: "Even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you" (Jn 11:22). When the answer to your prayer is not apparent, how do you respond to the love of Christ? Do you fall into despair and lose sight of your truest and most-powerful friend?

Finally, even in the midst of their grief and tears, Martha and Mary followed their Lord and Master to the tomb. Despite the stench of death, they did as Jesus commanded and took away the stone. When your situation stinks, do emotions and pain overwhelm the loving presence of Christ? Do you want to take over and turn away from the resurrection and the life?

As we continue our Lenten journey through the desert of COVID-19, Martha and Mary and Lazarus challenge us to discover how much Jesus loves each one of us—not only corporately as a community of faith, but also intimately and personally in our everyday lives—in our joys and in our challenges. And as we enter more deeply into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ—like Mary and Martha, through prayer, with faithfulness and trust, following his commandments—each of us will learn to confidently lean on the love and presence of God who "will give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit dwelling in you" (Rom 8:11).
