"Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

(Psalm 104)

Wisdom: Comes from the Latin word, Sapentia, which is derived from the verb "to taste." In the Letter of James, we read that wisdom comes from above as a gift of the Holy Spirit that is infused into the soul. From this we can see that Christian wisdom is a tasting, or experiencing in an intimate way, the mind and nature of God, which is revealed to us through the Holy Spirit. Wisdom is the ability to judge correctly, to discern what is just, not only through human reason, but also in the light of God's will. True wisdom is bound up in understanding of the divine and revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. It allows us to know God and savor his presence, but only if we seek after his will.

Understanding: The gift of understanding allows us to penetrate more deeply into the divine mysteries and to reach the fullness of the Catholic faith. It is far more than just knowing about God. Through the Holy Spirit, this gift helps us to understand the events that occur in our own lives, seeing and judging them according to the life of Christ.

Council: The gift of counsel helps us to know what we should or should not do in every situation that demands a moral decision. This gift, through the Holy Spirit helps a person to find his\her way along the winding and confusing paths of life that helps to make decisions leading to holiness.

Fortitude: This gift, in a real way, strengthens us to see ourselves as soldiers for Christ, freely willing to stand up and defend our faith in Jesus Christ. This gift strengthens the will and resolve, allowing a follower of Christ to stand firm to his or her convictions as a child and disciple of God.

Knowledge: This gift gives the Christian the supernatural light to see that all creation, our good actions, and all the good that has been achieved in history comes from God and is directed toward him. It involves supernatural understanding and surpasses what we are capable of achieving by our own efforts. Its development is depended on one's faithfulness and responding to grace. Through this gift, the Christian finds Christ not only in creation, but in every human encounter, event and activity.

Piety: This gift helps the Christian to live their life whereby everything, every part of their life, is oriented toward a relationship with God and that we are his children. We see and trust in God in everything around us. It has a great impact in how we treat and love others.

Fear of the Lord: This gift is bound up in the Christian understanding of a just God – a God who holds authority and dominion over the world. It is not a fear in the sense of being punished, but is defined by a profound love and we are afraid to disappoint the God who loves us.

 Health care providers in the family whose employment has resulted in financial hardships for the family.

4. Lost income due to a lack of childcare.

5. Members with pre-existing medical conditions that has caused them to self-quarantine, resulting in financial hardship for the family.

"Walking the Good Red Road: Nicholas Black Elk's Journey to Sainthood"

Documentary will air on Sunday, May 31 at 3 PM on KOTA (ABC). This retelling of Black Elk's life and legacy relies heavily on archival photographs and publications, expert interviews, and historical reenactments on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. The film encompasses his entire life and legacy culminating with his family's request that the Catholic Church declare him a saint. According to records from the Diocese of Rapid City, Black Elk was born around 1865. He came from a family of medicine men and he carried on their work. He was at the Battle of Little Big Horn close to the Montana-Wyoming border in 1876. Around 1877, he joined Buffalo Bill's Wild West show and toured in Europe. He returned to the U.S. in 1889. Through his interaction with Jesuit priests, he converted to the Catholic faith and was baptized on December 6, 1904, the feast of St. Nicholas. One biographer said he took the name Nicholas because he was inspired by the saint's generosity.
