Mt 25:29b

At the end of today's gospel reading, we hear Jesus say, "more will be given, and he will grow rich". When was the last time you spent time thinking about all the gifts God has given you? Hopefully, it was earlier today. But if it has been a while, stop right now, and take a few minutes to list off some of the gifts from God. Go ahead, I'll wait....

So, what kind of things are on your list? Maybe it is your spouse. Perhaps your children. Maybe some of the things on your list included you home, your job, your finances. Hopefully, you also including things like Jesus, his death and resurrection, his offering of his body and blood at every Mass. When we live our lives seeing everything we have and everything we are, as a gift from God, it changes how we live.

Sometimes, God gives us these gifts simply because He loves us and wants to give us the gift. But many of the gifts he gives us, he wants us to do something with them. Just like we heard Jesus tell us in the parable.

If God gave you the gift of teaching, He wants you to use that gift to teach others. It might be to formally teach others about himself and everything He created, from reading and writing for communications, chemistry, biology, and math for science, whatever of his creation he inspires you to teach. But it can also be to teach your children, your neighbors, about whatever it is God wants you to teach.

If God gave you the gift and desire to raise animals and crops, He wants you to use that gift to help feed your family, your neighbors, and the world. If God gave you the abilities and skills to be a doctor, nurse, or some other role in healthcare, you should use that gift to take care of people. These are just a few things. God has given each of use unique gifts which he wants us to do something with them.

When we do not use the gifts God gives us, if we just bury them, we put ourselves at risk of being thrown into the darkness "where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." But when we use the gifts God gives us, when we build up the Body of Christ, God will reward us with more gifts. Throughout our lives, we want to hear God say to us, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities." When we see everything as a gift, when we use the things God has given us to help grow the kingdom of God, we "will grow rich." So that at the end of your lives, He will welcome us into heaven, telling us "Come, share your master's joy."


