"Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved."

(Ps 80:4)

Jubilation from John

This Sunday's Psalm response seems contrary to our understanding of free will: "Lord, *make us* turn to you" (Ps 80:4). However, the response is actually begging God to change our hearts—because as much as we desire to do the right and avoid the wrong, temptation too often draws us willingly away from the eternal light of God's face. We need help—we need a little push. The Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, knows our hearts, and provides just such a nudge to change our hearts and turn us toward the Light: *the precepts of the Church*.

The five precepts of the Church are "meant to guarantee the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 2041). Although God wants our whole self, not just the minimum, these *minimum* requirements must be met to be a practicing Catholic. Though minimal, the "obligatory character of these positive laws" (*CCC* 2041) may be just the nudge you and I need to *make us* turn—and return—to God that we might be saved.

In brief, the five precepts are: (1) "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor" (*CCC* 2042); (2) "You shall confess your sins at least once a year" (*CCC* 2042); (3) "You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season" (*CCC* 2042); (4) "You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church" (*CCC* 2043); and (5) "You shall help provide for the needs of the Church" (*CCC* 2043).

As we enter the season of Advent, the second precept regarding the sacrament of Reconciliation should have a particular emphasis as we watch and wait for the Light of Salvation to dawn in the darkness of our sinful lives. As Jesus alluded to in this Sunday's Gospel, "watching and waiting" is not an idle activity—not a time to fall asleep and rest until "the lord of the house" arrives. Advent is a time to give our spiritual houses a good cleaning "so that you are not lacking any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor 1:7).

For this reason, the local Church offers special opportunities—communal penance services—to practice the second precept during the season of Advent. **The OLBH penance service is scheduled for Friday, December 11, at 6:00-7:30PM.** If this day and time does not fit your schedule, watch the bulletin for the days and times of penance services at other area parishes. Regardless of where and when, the communal penance services offer you and I the convenient help and the little push to turn and return to the Lord so that we may be prepared for his arrival.

A member of our Stewardship Council, Pam Freeman, captured so beautifully this nudge toward the face of Christ in the confessional: "Over the years, I've seen and accepted the priest I'm confessing to as the receptor for Jesus and have had some powerful experiences with a couple priests where I've really felt God's presence—and the feeling of forgiveness was overwhelming. I do not really view it as confessing, but as saying what I've done out loud which makes what I've done, said, or thought more real... Confession closes the gap between Christ and myself. It brings an awareness of how I offend God without even realizing it." Well said, well done, amen!
