Jewels from Joni

How do we fulfill our Baptism promises of passing on our faith and telling others about Jesus Christ? In my faith formation during my younger years, it was by memorizing the *Baltimore Catechism's* questions and answers. As I got older and down the road in my faith journey, I realized that I really did not know my faith. I was socialized but I did not hold a conviction or commitment that involved my everyday life. But how does one learn to have that conviction and commitment?

Jesus gives us insight as to how He went about it. He knew how to engage in the people's everyday life. The parables are examples of teaching in a way that related to individuals. The last command that Jesus gave to each of us who are baptized is "Go, make disciples of all nations... and behold, I am with you always" (Mt 25:19-20).

I remember my promise as we brought our three daughters for Baptism—to teach them the faith of the Catholic Church to the best of my ability:

"In asking for Baptism for your child, you are undertaking the responsibility of raising her in the faith, so that, in keeping God's commandments, she may love the Lord and her neighbor as Christ has taught us. Do you understand this responsibility?" (*Rite of Baptism*)

I found it overwhelming as I thought about that responsibility. I knew how to teach them the prayers and to attend Mass. However, I found a real relationship with Jesus after I attended a course called *Discovering Christ*. I could experience His presence in my everyday life. This experience of His Presence made it easier for me to tell our daughters about Him and about my faith in His plan for my life. I only wish I had attended *Discovering Christ* sooner, when my daughters were growing up. "And behold, I am with you always." He was always there to help me with this promise I made to Him. I just needed to know Him as a friend.

Discovering Christ is the first course of the *ChristLife* series and has two major goals: 1) To enter into or renew a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, experience the love of God the Father, and be empowered by the Holy Spirit to live as God's children; and 2) To learn skills to accompany others seeking Jesus. Each session of *Discovering Christ* has four components that are vital to the evangelization process: Dinner, Welcome and Prayer, Video Teaching, and Small-Group Discussion. There is a day-retreat after the fifth session.

I invite you to attend the seven sessions of *Discovering Christ* that will begin Wednesday, October 21, 2020, with dinner at 5:30 pm. (Parents, if you attend and you have children participating in faith formation on Wednesdays, we will feed your family, too.) Attendance at *Discovering Christ* will be limited to the first 20 participants to maintain safe distance and to follow CDC guidelines.
