Dear Friends.

Mercy is a great gift that as disciples of Christ, we are called to share with each other. It is the mercy we pray for when we think of our salvation, our walk with God and when we have experienced pain and hurt. It was the message of Divine Mercy that has encouraged Sister Faustina to proclaim it to the world. It was the compassion that has led Saint John Paull II to proclaim the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. But mercy presumes that someone is guilty and that we need to be forgiven. And that is right. But I see in today's reading something more than just guilt and failure. I see mercy as a source of hope.

Looking at the events of the Holy Week and the tremendous love God has showed us in the Passion of Christ, I see in the Divine Mercy as great generosity of God. God is ready to share with us everything He is (not what he has, but who he is). As Jesus makes himself know to the Apostles, he shares with them the wisdom, peace, and the time. But Jesus is not afraid to go even to the limits to encourage us to have faith in Him. Thomas is not present the first-time Jesus visits the Apostles. For him, the idea that Jesus is risen is still too much, he demands an empirical proof. And Jesus in his generosity (not just mercy), invites Thomas to come forward and to touch his wounds. The Risen Christ not only allows Thomas to see him, but he also allows him to touch his wounds and to put even his hand into his side. That is true gift of love and a sign of a generous heart of Jesus. Who of us is willing to give ourselves totally, unless we have to, must or have an internal motive? Jesus does that because He cares and wants us to have it all.

The Divine Mercy is an act of Love and it is also an act of total generosity as we can experience Jesus in his humanity (the wounds of the cross and of our sins), and in his divinity (the gift of faith that comes to us in the resurrection). Listening to today's Gospel, let us remember that Jesus does not come to us to shame and punish us, but that He wants us to experience His generosity in a gift of Divine Mercy as a source of hope, encouragement and as an invitation to trust him beyond what makes sense to us. Edward Everett Hale wrote once:" I am only one, but still, I am one. I cannot do everything, but I can do something; and because I cannot do everything, I will not refuse to do the something that I can do." Mercy is a gift of generosity, from God to us and from us to those around us. Share the gift of mercy not only because you need to but also because you are generous. As generous as is Jesus in his Divine Love.

Sunday of Divine Mercy

Acts 4:32-35 | 1 Jn 5:1-6 | Jn 20:19-31



Do you ever have times – at the dinner table or at a gathering of friends – where all seems right with the world? I often hold my breath, conscious of the fragility of those moments, fearful that saying something might jinx things. It's a little like rooting for a pitcher cruising into the bottom of the ninth with a no-hitter – that feeling that we are on the verge of perfection. Well, as Christians, we are on that verge, although perfection will not come in this life but the next. And so, as fleeting as these human moments feel, and can actually be, we are reminded in today's psalm: "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting ... Let those who fear the Lord say, 'His mercy endures forever.'" As we celebrate this Divine Mercy Sunday, and enter the second week of Easter, let us give thanks for the gift of God's great mercy, and pray for the grace to be as loving and merciful to others.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I'm taken by the story of doubting Thomas. For a long time I've focused on the "doubting" part of his name, the fact that he demanded to place his fingers in the nail marks and his hand in Jesus' side. However, when Jesus addresses Thomas, Thomas' response is immediate and unqualified: "My Lord and my God!" Thomas has recognized the divine nature of Jesus; he sees him not just as the man he has followed, but as God. As Catholics, we may sometimes face questions about how the Church has come to believe and teach certain things. Thomas' ultimate affirmation encourages us to be steadfast in our faith, and to be patient with any of our own and others' questions. That is because Christ will come to meet us where we are. As the Incarnation of God's divine mercy, Jesus Christ is the one who hears our doubts and insecurities, and he answers them: "Here I am. Look at me. Touch me. Feel my presence." Thomas was not afraid, and we need not fear either. God's mercy is upon us, "and the victory that conquers the world is our faith." Let us witness to our faith as Thomas did to his.
