Jubilation from John

Last Sunday as we entered the Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel of St. John, we encountered a crowd "stuck in the sign." With their bellies full of the miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fish, the crowd crossed the Sea of Galilee, seeking Jesus and his disciples—and demanding more signs: "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do?" (Jn 6:30). In this Sunday's excerpt from the discourse, Jesus Christ answers directly, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51).

Repeatedly and in no uncertain words, Jesus Christ revealed to the crowd that HE IS THE SIGN! However, it is only through the lens of the Lord's Supper that the true meaning of the sign became clearly visible. His body and his blood—under the appearances of bread and wine—is the spiritual nourishment "that comes down from heaven so that one may eat and not die" (Jn 6:50). But even when we accept by faith Christ's Real Presence—body and blood, soul and divinity—in the Eucharist, we too can get "stuck in the sign." What does the sign point to in our lives? Where does it lead us? How does it affect our relationships with God, our families and neighbors, our classmates and coworkers, even our enemies?

If the sign is efficacious, the Eucharist cannot begin and end at the altar. The outpouring of the Divine Presence must continue outside the doors of the church. For me, the belief that the Holy Spirit changes bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ on the altar points to the possibility—to the reality—that the same Holy Spirit has the power to change us into the presence of Christ outside these doors.

This transformation is precisely what St. Paul wrote about in this Sunday's reading from his letter to the Ephesians. "All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God as forgiven you in Christ" (Eph 4:31-32). St. Paul challenged them to be a sign of God's kingdom in Ephesus as Christ is the sign come down from God's kingdom: "Be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God" (Eph 5:1-2).

Whether our belief in the Real Presence of Christ stops at the altar or is carried into our everyday lives is measured by how much we actually see a difference in our lives over time. Are we becoming more charitable, more just, more holy? Is this observable in our everyday actions? Do we say fewer unkind words? Are we more aware of the needs of others? Are we more joyful and hopeful? The Eucharist changes not only the substance of bread and wine—it also can and must change us, our church, and our world. The hungry crowd is still seeking a sign of God's presence. Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life!



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink - bread from heaven - that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, perhaps we can say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.

REFLECT Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle - the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world - or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!
