(Collect, Third Sunday of Advent)

Waiting... Waiting... Waiting... As this Sunday's *Collect* expresses, the Season of Advent is a season of waiting. Waiting and watching... Waiting with eager anticipation... Waiting in faith and hope... The Advent scriptures are filled with the theme of waiting—and the Third Sunday of Advent's readings are no exception. The prophet Zephaniah eagerly anticipated the day when the judgment of the Lord would be removed from fallen Jerusalem and a mighty savior would rejoice over his people and renew their love for him. But that day would be long wait—more than six centuries until the Savior, Jesus the Christ, entered the Holy City. The apostle Paul faithfully awaited the Second Coming of the Lord and encouraged the Philippians to have no anxiety about the delay. But little did he know that twenty-one centuries would pass—and we are still waiting. The crowds along the River Jordan were filled with the hope that John the Baptist might be the long-awaited Christ—but the Baptist told them that their watching and waiting was for another greater than he.

In comparison, our Advent wait for the feast of the Lord's Nativity is only four weeks long—but we are not a patient people. Christmas decorations start filling store shelves as soon as Halloween costumes are cleared. Amazon Prime moves Christmas gifts from a distant warehouse to our doorsteps in two days or less. Flickering Advent candles are quickly overwhelmed by hundreds of flashing multi-colored Christmas lights on eaves and lawns. However, despite my impatience, I have had a beautiful yet challenging experience of waiting during this Advent.

As many of you know, our daughter Jessi and her husband Harlan have been in the process of adopting a baby for over a year. In July, they were matched with a loving and generous lady who wanted to share the joy of parenthood with them. Each month, they made an eight-hour journey to attend ultrasounds and watch their babies grow and mature—and get to know the mother who would bless them with identical twin girls!

On the second day of Advent, November 29, Jessi, and Harlan attended the delivery of two small but healthy cherubs—and the Advent wait began for me. Overnight, we had two more granddaughters, but they are separated from us by eight hours of driving, a state line or two, and a mound of paperwork. We can only wait—and watch them in photographs and on FaceTime. Waiting with eager anticipation for the day they are released from the hospital. Waiting in faith and hope that all the bureaucratic hurdles will be cleared, and they can come home to Black Hawk.

And during this Advent time, I've discovered another aspect of waiting—an aspect colored by this Sunday's pink candle and rose vestments—the aspect of joyful waiting. Despite the uncertain time before the Savior's arrival, Zephaniah encouraged the people: "Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel!" (Zep 3:14). Despite the unknown time of the Lord's Second Coming, Paul urged the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!" (Phil 4:4). Until the Mightier One was revealed in their midst, John the Baptist exhorted the people and preached joyful news. During this Advent Season, despite our impatience, let us discover and rediscover the joy of waiting and watching—waiting with joyful anticipation—until we experience the joy of the Lord's Nativity and the ultimate joy of his Second Coming.

Advent Candle Support Stand

The Advent candle support stand was made by Deacon Walt Wilson.

The heavy steel bottom circle **[A]** represents the Old Testament and the middle steel circle **[B]** represents the New Testament.

The four vertical steel rods **[C]** tying them together represent the four Gospel writers; Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The rods support a cross **[D]** that is the symbol of our salvation.

The shiny copper covering **[E]** the middle of the cross represents Jesus.

The hammer dents on the copper **[E]** represent the blows Jesus received as He was nailed to the cross.

The steel outer ring attached to the cross represents the universe **[F]**. The middle steel ring represents the world we live in **[G]**.

Together, these represent the faith we are taught and believe in, that Jesus is the center of our universe, our world, and our lives.



The pink candle represents this Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus. Gaudete Sunday shifts the focus of Advent from the Lord is coming to the Lord is near. The shift in color reminds us to REJOICE (Gaudete is Latin for rejoice) and the lighter color reminds us of a heightened sense of joyous anticipation.

Zep 3:14-18a | Phil 4:4-7 | Lk 3:10-18

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Although spontaneous outbursts of joy are not part of our liturgy, today's readings alert us that we have much reason to rejoice. Even in times of anxiety, we can rely on the words of St. Paul, who writes that we can rest assured that "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard [our] hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." As we prepare for his coming during this Advent season, we don't need to leap out of our pews and make a show of our praise (but go for it, if that's your style!). However, in our hearts and in our prayer, we can follow the psalmist's lead and "cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel." We can praise God in many ways, through fervent prayer, simple acts of kindness and, as John the Baptist did so well, sharing the Good News.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

"What should we do?" The crowds asked John the Baptist a deceptively simple question many of us wrestle with today. How do we prepare for Christ's coming? How should we spend the next hour, the day, the next year, the next five? John the Baptist answers without reservation: Share what you have. Don't be greedy. Do not falsely accuse others. In other words, get it together! The Lord is coming. Advent is a wonderful time to do just that, and St. Paul reminds us that we don't have to know all the answers. "The Lord is near," he writes, "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." Last week, the readings encouraged us to discern what is truly valuable in our lives as Christians. Today's readings encourage us to ask the Lord: "What should we do?" Just as John the Baptist showed the people how to prepare for Christ's coming, the Lord shows us how to live out and share our faith through the Scriptures and in the silence of prayer.

ACTIONS Remember the last time you felt unadulterated joy?

For me it was when my son smacked a game-winning goal at a hockey game. As we move through Advent, we can reawaken a sense of childlike joy as we prepare to celebrate Christ among us. As you light the Advent candle, take time to share with one another something that gave you joy within the past week.
