“This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.”

(Mk 9:7)

After living in relative isolation for nine months because of a pandemic, the polar vortex was the last straw—and FaceBook somehow knew it! As the temperature plunged precipitously below zero, up popped an AirBnB advertisement for a house atop a Caribbean atoll—a luxurious house that sleeps eight, completely isolated, surrounded by clear blue water teeming with tropical fish. We immediately texted the link to our daughters and their families—all of whom excitedly replied, “Let’s go for it!” And yet we all knew that for various reasons, we couldn’t travel and had to stay in our isolated iceboxes.

As Peter, James, and John ascended the mountain of Transfiguration, they may have felt the same desire to simply escape from reality. The Gospel accounts of the Transfiguration are preceded by Jesus’ first prediction of his Passion—a prediction that must have chilled his disciples to the very bone—and Jesus’ challenge to join him in his suffering and death: “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me; for whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it” (Mk 8:34-35). Is it any wonder the disciples needed a trip up a mountain to escape from the dark valley ahead of them?

Although the beatific vision that Peter, James, and John experienced on the mountain top must have brought some respite from their anxiety, they didn’t even have time to pitch tents before a cloud obliterated the dazzling light and cast a shadow over them. “*This is my beloved Son. Listen to him*” (Mk 9:7). Listen to *him*?? The beloved Son has just told us that he must suffer greatly and be rejected and be killed! And beyond that, he told us that to follow him, we must deny ourselves and carry a cross and lose our lives for his sake. Listening to him will take us back down—back down to the cold, dark valley of reality below!

Nonetheless, the disciples listened and followed Jesus down the mountain. Despite the fact that they still questioned what rising from the dead meant, their hearts and minds had experienced a transfiguration. The true nature of Jesus alone had been revealed to them: not just a teacher and healer, not just a prophet and lawgiver who spoke with authority, but the Son of God who completely shared in his heavenly Father’s divine nature.

Listen to him. These are the words that call you and me off the mountain—or the tropical island—today. These are the words that beckon us to continue our Lenten journey in an ongoing pandemic and through another polar blast that surely will come. *Listen to him.* The Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving provide the opportunity to transfigure our minds and hearts to recognize the voice of God—and to listen more actively and love more completely.

As we continue our Lenten journey, Jesus Christ invites us to come down the mountain and walk with him to the cross. Unlike Peter, James, and John, we know what lies ahead—their questions about rising from the dead were answered in the brilliant dawning of Easter. Let us hear the words of God on the mountain and keep them more faithfully through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. *Listen to him!*

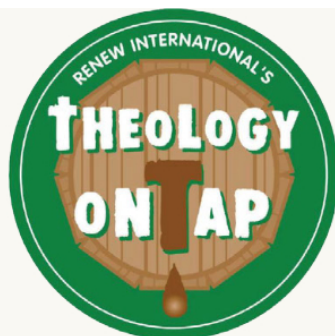
