"The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Mark 1:15

"What do you want to be when you grow up?" As soon as the teacher asked the question, a forest of hands shot up. The children were keen to answer." A vet, because I like animals, a nurse, because I like to help people, a farmer, a shopkeeper, a teacher."

"Expect the unexpected" would be good advice for many of the characters we meet in the scriptures. Take for example, Jonah. Jonah was living unremarkable and presumably happy life until the word of the Lord came to him, asking him to go and preach repentance to the people of Nineveh. It was not a calling that Jonah wanted. It was not just that he did not want the disruption to his life that the call to be a prophet would undoubtedly cause. He thought of Nineveh as nothing more than a notoriously wicked pagan city. The people did not merit the chance to hear the word of the Lord. Why should they be given the chance to repent and find salvation when, as far as Jonah was concerned, all they deserved was to be punished for their sins? And so, Jonah's first reaction was to resist the Lord's call and to run away. And then there was Simon. From his earliest days, Simon had known what he wanted to do. He wanted to be a fisherman. He had been brought up with the life, living in a lake-side community. He had learned well and was good at his job. He had married and settled down to provide for his family. And he enjoyed working with his brother Andrew. It was a hard life, but it was a good life. This, he assumed, would be his future. But the Lord had other plans for Simon and his brother. They met Jesus, this new, preacher, who seemed to speak with and authority they had never heard before. And when he called them to be his disciples, everything changed. In contrast to Jonah, there was no attempt to resist the call or to run away. On the contrary, "at once they left their nets and followed him". They knew that it was the only thing to do. Even though it meant that their lives would never be the same again.

Today, we need to ask ourselves a question; are we open to hear God's call? And how do we respond when it comes? We all have our own plans, our own dreams, our hopes for the future. Yet all of us will face times of change in our lives. When things do not turn out the way we expect, can we perceive the hand of God in this?

Paul's advice in today's second reading is clear. We need to set our eyes on God. Paul expected the second coming of Christ to be very soon, and he exhorted his congregations to live in constant expectation of it.

Both Jonah and Jesus preached repentance. Repentance may not be a popular word nowadays. But the word "repent" means to "change one's mind". And so, the call to repentance is a call to look at the direction of our lives. Our minds need to be open to hear God's word to us. And if that word is calling us to change direction, to change the way our lives are heading, to change the way we think and act, then we need to respond to it as the first disciple did. We might struggle and try to run away like Jonah or might respond as did Simon and Andrew, following Jesus with full trust. We need to remember that it is God who is calling not us, and therefore it is God who is in charge, not us.
