"An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided."

(1 Cor 7:32-33)

Jubilation from John

When I first reflected upon this Sunday's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, I said to my wife Joni, "All right, now I have an excuse for not serving Christ as I should—I'm divided, conflicted by my anxiety trying to please you—but Fr. Andrzej has no excuse!" I think Joni responded, "You keep it up and you'll be joining him in celibacy!"

Indeed, this passage from First Corinthians has been used to support and defend the discipline of celibacy. It's too bad that St. Paul never had the opportunity to read the words of the angel Gabriel to Mary in the first chapter of Luke's gospel: "Nothing will be impossible for God!" (Lk 1:37). Although perpetually a virgin, Mary also was a wife to Joseph and a mother to a son who probably caused her no small amount of anxiety—and yet she ranks first in the fellowship of the saints, the Mother of God, and the Mother of the Church.

Virgin, mother, wife, widow—regardless of the circumstances of her life, Mary lived all these vocations led by that same Spirit that overshadowed her at the Annunciation. She lived all of these states with that same assent to the will of God that she humbly expressed in her *fiat* to the angel: "*Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word*" (Lk 1:38).

A fuller, richer understanding of today's passage from Corinthians is that all of us Christians should live according to the vocation to which we have been called. Matrimony and celibacy are two states of life in which a Christian life can be fully lived. Since those two states should include everyone reading these words, each of us has a vocation—and it should be lived with integrity for the glory of God, in fullest accord with our Lord's commandments to love God and to love neighbor.

So why should there be any anxiety in our lives? I suspect that Fr. Andrzej is as anxious about the things of the Lord—about pleasing the Lord—as I am about the things of the world—about pleasing my wife and family. St. Paul was absolutely right about this point: we are anxious because our hearts and our hands are divided. In our weekday vocations, we struggle to adhere to the Lord without distraction. On Monday, my actions don't always reflect the words that I so easily preached on Sunday.

Whether I am a husband or a father or a deacon or a retired engineer—or you are a wife or a mother or a single parent or a surviving spouse or a seeking single—or a celibate priest—we are called to live all of these circumstances each and every day as servants of the Lord. Believing that nothing is impossible with God—letting go and letting God do it according to his word. Keep the Faith!




