Our Lady of the Black Hills exists to proclaim the joy of the Gospel to all creation and to transform lives with the Father's mercy. "Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick, no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic." (Mk 6:7-9)

Two weeks ago, we heard wisdom from Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, "Whoever had much did not have more, and whoever had little did not have less." (2 Cor 8) In the Gospel today, we hear about the disciples being sent out into the world. However, they are to take with them only what is necessary to their ministry. This is also a great challenge to us today, as present-day apostles and friends of Jesus. Whether we have "much" or "little," enough or are still missing something is a matter of perspective. A lot depends on our outlook on life and on what matters to us. Yes, it is important to have things, material possessions or something that makes us proud. The question is however, how much or how many things it will take to make us happy or fulfill our dreams. How many things does a person need in order to prove himself or to realize the beauty that is already within herself? We are attached to many things and quite often we think that extra money would solve our problems.

One of the great "privileges" of being a priest is that we have to move every so often. Now, I know that this moving is not always the most desirable event for the priest or for the people, but that is the life of a priest. However, every time I move, I have an opportunity to reevaluate my possessions. When you have to pack everything, you own and carry out the boxes, you start to think and pay attention to them. The words of Jesus to the disciples "take nothing for the journey" are becoming very appealing. Of course, there are some things that we keep because of the sentimental value, but even that can be reevaluated. Is it easy to part with some things? No. Should we be honest with ourselves and the reasons we keep things stored up in our homes? Yes. The spiritual aspect of our life can be a great support in this challenging but vital task.

Now, in the spirit of today's Gospel and the teaching of Jesus, I invite you to take some time and reexamine the values we use to justify a new purchase, new things we "need," or the things we already own. I am not saying you should sell your home and move to another, just so you have to pack all your things – though some of the local business would agree with this idea. What I am inviting you to do is to pray about the values in your life, try to challenge yourselves as individuals, as spouses and as families, and see if you can put in place a few guidelines you would be willing to use when you are considering "a second tunic or extra sack or money in your belt." As guidelines for this spiritual exercise, you might consider wisdom from this scripture: Mt 5 or 1 Cor 13. After all, remember to ask yourself "Do I own things or do things own me?" And this includes the ideas and things we carry in our hearts.



# Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Am 7:12-15 | Eph 1:3-14 or 1:3-10 | Mk 6:7-13




I don't know about you, but even for the quickest of errands I don't like to leave my house without my smartphone. Nor would I go on a road trip without my trusty mini-Diet Coke and a snack or two. So I'm struck by what Jesus tells the Apostles when he sends them on their mission to share the Good News: "He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts." While it may be hard for us to imagine striking out with only the sandals on our feet, to me this reading is more about what the Apostles did have than what they went without: They had a companion (Jesus sent them two by two) and the spiritual blessings Saint Paul refers to, including a relationship with Jesus and absolute trust in him. Today's readings remind us to set aside distractions and spend time deepening our relationship with Jesus through prayer, reading the Scriptures, and participating in the sacramental life of the Church. In doing so, we, too, can join in the mission of the early disciples by giving our lives to Jesus and sharing his message with others.

# GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I find the phrase "the new evangelization" somewhat ironic. After all, evangelization is not new, it goes back to the earliest days of the Church, which wouldn't exist had it not been for the disciples. The "new" part reminds us that we today also share in this mission. The U.S. Catholic bishops describe it succinctly: "The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel." This call is both simple, and challenging, but we don't have to be perfect. After all, just as God called Amos, a humble shepherd, and Jesus called the Twelve, a motley group of fishermen, he calls us. Like them, our first "task" isn't a task at all – it is placing God and our relationship with Jesus at the center of our lives. Only then can we effectively share the Gospel with others, inviting our brothers and sisters to a life in Christ – to become part of God's adopted family.

**WITNESS** At the end of Sunday Mass, we often hear the words: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." As we are sent forth, let us ask God to show us how we can share the Gospel with others during the week ahead. Then pay attention to where the Spirit leads us in answering our prayer.
