Our Lady of the Black Hills exists to proclaim the joy of the Gospel to all creation and to transform lives with the Father's mercy. "So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6:32-35)

As the summer goes on, many of us experience a very valuable lesson of life. In the first reading today, we hear of the people of Israel wandering though the desert. Hot and dry weather is not too easy to handle for many, as we could experience in the last few days. So, the people begun to grumble and complain. They quickly forgot how they got led away from the slavery in Egypt, and now they simply focus on the needs of their life, physical life. With the gift of manna and quail, they are invited to experience the generosity of God and at the same time to learn a lesson of trust and relying on God.

Mother Teresa would say that we slip into spiritual poverty as we rely more and more on the possessions we own. To change such spiritual poverty, we need to find another source of fulfillment in our lives. A source of such fulfillment can be found in our unity with Christ who himself became "poor". The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that, "Jesus enjoins his disciples to prefer him to everything and everyone, and bids them "renounce all that [they have]" for his sake and that of the Gospel (Lk 14:33). Shortly before his passion he gave them the example of the poor widow of Jerusalem who, out of her poverty, gave all that she had to live on (Lk 21:4). The precept of detachment from riches is obligatory for entrance into the Kingdom of heaven." (CCC 2544)

We are preparing for life in the Kingdom of Heaven by learning to live only by the grace of God, by being "poor" so that we are always ready to rely on God. That does not mean we cannot own anything. It does, however, pose a question as to how many things own us. It is a difficult teaching as many of us have many things. The Church provides an explanation to our questions. "The kingdom belongs to the poor and lowly, which means those who have accepted with humble hearts that we all and with all belong to Christ. Jesus is sent to "preach good news to the poor," he declares them blessed, for "theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Mt 5:3)

Often as we hear the word "poor," we think of people who own nothing, wear old clothes, and stand on the street corners asking for help. But being "poor" in the context of faith means much more. Perhaps the greatest difference in being poor in the material world or in a spiritual sense is the answer to the question: "Do I long for the things of this world or do I look for the gift of God?" This is a question each of us must answer to. "All Christ's faithful are to direct their affection rightly, less they be hindered in their pursuit of perfect charity by the use of worldly things and by an adherence to riches which is contrary to the spirit of evangelical poverty." (CCC 2545)





GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In our house, we know we've got a situation when we run out of bread. It's the staff of life, yes, but also the stuff that makes toast, goes with soup or salad, and smells so good when we bake it ourselves. So perhaps some of us can relate to the Israelites in the first reading as they "grumbled against Moses and Aaron," before the Lord promised to "rain down bread from heaven for [them]." On a deeper level, perhaps we also truly understand the importance of what Jesus tells his disciples in today's Gospel: that the bread from heaven which the Father gives will not only satisfy their physical hunger, but give life to the world. Jesus says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Just as the disciples heartily responded "give us this bread always," today's readings encourage us to long not only for all good gifts from the Father, but specifically for that one, unique gift of the Son whose nourishment to us in the Eucharist transforms us and "gives life to the world."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Like many Catholics, I attended Mass online for much of 2020 and the first half of 2021. Initially, it seemed like enough, and I was immensely grateful for the opportunity to hear the Word of God, see the Lord in the Eucharist, and to receive him spiritually. However, as we began to return to church this past spring, I truly felt the enormity of what I had been missing: receiving the Eucharist, and doing so within a community. As we hear Christ's words in the bread of life discourse over the next few Sundays, the magnitude of God's gracious gift should become ever more apparent. When we receive the Eucharist at Mass, we partake in the body and blood of Jesus, sharing in the divine banquet that leads us to everlasting life, and drawing closer to Jesus and to one another in the process. Nourished by his presence within us, we can then go out and share the bread of life with others. What that looks like will differ for each of us, but ultimately it is all for the purpose of accomplishing the works of God: believing in the One he sent and giving witness to that belief in all we say and do.

ACTION Paul's Letter to the Ephesians admonishes his listeners to "put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth." As we begin each day this week, we can pray for the grace to "put on a new self" and let go of those things that get in the way of our own holiness.
