The Year of St. Joseph

Pope Francis has proclaimed a "Year of St. Joseph" from December 8, 2020-December 8, 2021. Friday, March 19, 2021 is the feast of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I encourage you to look at the prayers and resources found at <https://www.rapidcitydiocese.org/stjoseph/>. You can also pick up information on St. Joseph on the table in the gathering space.

By partaking in the year of St. Joseph, a plenary indulgence will be received under the following circumstances according to the decree by Pope Francis. A plenary indulgence will be granted to the faithful under the following usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions) to Christians who with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year in this manner:

- Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes meditations on St. Joseph.
- Perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy.
- Recite the Holy Rosary in families and among engaged couples.
- Entrust daily work and activity to the protection of St. Joseph; invoke the intercession of St. Joseph so that those seeking work can find dignifying work.
- Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for the persecuted Church for the relief of Christians persecute both inside and outside of the Church.
- Recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph. Especially, To you, O blessed Joseph, on March 19, May 1, December 27, and on the 19th of every month. Wednesdays are dedicated to the memory of St. Joseph.
- For the elderly, sick, dying and those unable to leave the house, who recite an act of piety to St. Joseph under his title of Comfort of the Sick and Patron of a happy death, provided they offer their discomfort to God and fulfill the conditions for the indulgence "as soon as possible."

To you, O blessed Joseph, do we come in our tribulation, and having implored the help of your most holy spouse, we confidently invoke your patronage also.

Through that charity which bound you to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God and through the paternal love with which you embraced the Child Jesus, we humbly beg you graciously to regard the inheritance which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood, and with your power and strength to aid us in our necessities.

O most watchful Guardian of the Holy Family, defend the chosen children of Jesus Christ; O most loving father, ward off from us every contagion of error and corrupting influence; O our most mighty protector, be propitious to us and from heaven assist us in our struggle with the power of darkness; and, as once you rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril, so now protect God's Holy Church from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity; shield, too, each one of us by your constant protection, so that, supported by your example and your aid, we may be able to live piously, to die holily, and to obtain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

I encourage you to join me and Deacon Greg at Wisdom Wednesday on March 17 at 6:30 PM in the Church to hear more about Fatherhood. For further study and spiritual exercise see the book by Donald H. Calloway, Consecration to St. Joseph.
