"Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love."

John 15:9-10

Throughout our life, we have many ways and reasons to celebrate and to remember important dates and moments in our life. Sometimes I get to look at some of the old photographs, that remind me of the times past. I feel a bit sad and worried about some of the new gadgets that help us to capture thousands of moments, but at the same time they become obsolete and can easily be lost for the future. They all are different and observed in different ways. They all however have one common link; they are part of our traditions.

Traditions are events that help us put our lives in the perspective of our history, cultural identity, and personal lives. We remember these dates to help us learn and grow in our life. But aside from our regular traditions, there are also our spiritual traditions which are part of our journey. The Church Tradition is a way that we live out our faith as we make the words of Jesus come alive.

The Gospel passage today reminds us that God in His wisdom provides us with the Holy Spirit to teach and instruct us in our understanding of Him. Could God tell us all that we should know of Him? Yes, certainly. But would we be able to comprehend and understand all that we should? That is a different question. The world is definitely not the same as the one in which Jesus was physically present.

The apostles of Christ today are not the same as the apostles were two thousand years ago and yet we see faith alive and prospering. How can this be? Jesus says "Do not let your hearts be troubled" as he assures us that the Father will provide us with the Spirit to understand. The Tradition of the Catholic Church calls us constantly to reevaluate who we are today as we use the experiences of the past. More to it, our Tradition constantly reminds us that what we do today, as different as it can sometimes be from the experiences of previous generations, needs to reflect our unity with generations past.

The Gospel we read today must reflect the Gospel Jesus preached to His Disciples. The power of achievement is in self-discipline and determination to follow one's hopes and dreams. It is in consistency that we make progress and keep our dignity strong. God desires us to be in full union with Him one day and thus we will find constant support to achieve this promise. It is in the Holy Spirit's guidance that we look at the Gospel and see in it not only what was written by the Gospel writer, but also what the message of God is for us today.

The Church in Her wisdom makes every effort to ensure that today's teachings are consistent with the teachings of every generation and that they reflect the Spirit of Christ among us. Catholic Tradition may sometimes be view as "archaic", but it is in that Tradition that we find consistency and self-discipline. As Intentional Disciples, are we ready and willing to continue the Tradition, are we ready and willing to live the Mission of Christ?

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I have 20/15 vision. I can see things in the distance as well as close up. But that doesn't mean I can see everything perfectly. Because of a difference in how each eye focuses, I can't find those hidden images in "magic eye" posters, and forget trying to watch a 3D movie! Seeing all things perfectly is not something many of us could claim, including Peter. And yet, with God's help, he understands a vision God gave to him: "In truth," Peter says, "I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation, whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." Through God's mercy and Jesus' redemptive cross, the kingdom of God has been prepared for all peoples. God's saving power has been revealed. With faith, and the help of the Holy Spirit in living out the commandments, we can fix our eyes on Christ – the revelation of God's love who came into the world that we might have life through him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

So much information comes to us every day, in all forms of media, there are now even shortcuts to the shortcuts for grasping the content. My personal favorite is the abbreviation, "TL; DR" which means, "too long, didn't read." Some might claim that we are dumbing down our culture with this type of shorthand notation, or we could argue that clear, concise, and straightforward is simply best. And that is what Jesus gives us today in his one commandment: "Love one another as I love you." He offers commentary for the commandment and gives reasons for why he is telling it to us, but the crux of it cannot be missed: love one another. It is a commandment both simple, yet complex; easy, yet at times exponentially difficult to live. So Jesus provides the key to fulfilling it by saying, "remain in my love" [emphasis mine]. Faithfulness to a sacramental life and participation in communal living give us the grace to remain in that love - which in turn transforms and enables us to share that love with others.

PRAY To honor the celebration of Mother's Day, pray the Rosary today for the intentions of our mothers, for those who have been motherly influences to us, and for those who long to be mothers.
