What are your HABITS?

The Greatest

Today, I am primarily writing to the men. I encourage everyone to read this article, to implement the ideas applicable to them, and to help encourage the men in their lives to step "Into the Breach", to become one of the greatest, to become not just a leader, but a servant leader.

In today's Gospel reading, we hear about the Apostles "discussing among themselves ... who was the greatest." Jesus sits them down and says:

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Father Burke Masters says that the difference between men and boys is that boys are concerned about themselves, while men are concerned about others. All men are called to be the greatest person God created them to be. All men are called to be a servant leader. It is how God created men.

In the video "Leaders Aren't Born, They're Made" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pRePr8I7RFA), the first episode of the Knights of Columbus series "Into the Breach", based on Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted challenge to the men of his diocese—to step into the breach. His exhortation, Into the Breach: An Apostolic Exhortation to Catholic Men, identifies the crisis of faith facing the Church today and presents a vision of the role of Catholic men in combatting it.

Into the Breach video series is a call to battle for Catholic Men which urges them to embrace wholeheartedly masculine virtues in a world in crisis. This hard-hitting video series illustrates the gravity of our duty as men of Christ and offers an inspiring invitation to renew authentic masculinity.

Why are you here? To know God. To love God. To serve God. If you are a man, you are called to share the faith. You are called to live the faith. Step into the breach and discover your role as a Catholic man in today's world.

In the series, it encourages us to develop good HABITS. Start on just one. And once you have developed this habit, even if it takes several months or more, then begin to work on another.

H–Holy hour (commitment to daily personal prayer)

A-Accountability (commitment to honest accountability with a trusted friend)

B–Bible (commitment to praying with Scripture)


I–Invest (commitment of time, treasure, and talent)

T –Tell (commitment to telling others the difference Jesus has made in vour life)

S – Sacraments (commitment to frequent reception of Eucharist and reconciliation)



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Our oldest son is deaf. I vividly remember watching him notice sounds for the first time in the days after his cochlear implant was activated: the "caw" of a crow, a doorbell, the low rumble of the furnace kicking in. Our job as parents was to provide a running commentary to help him understand the meaning of each sound that so many of us take for granted: "See the birds? That is a crow!" "Your dad is home." "The heat is coming on." I'm reminded of those early days when I read Mark's account of Jesus restoring hearing to the deaf man. While most of us can hear, so often we take the sounds all around us for granted or relegate them to background noise including the Scripture we hear at Mass each week. As Bishop Robert Barron writes, "This deaf man stands for all of us who do not hear the word of God, who have grown oblivious to it." As we listen to today's readings, we can ask Jesus to open our ears and our hearts to the word of God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Mark spares no detail in describing Jesus' encounter with the deaf man who had a speech impediment. Jesus places a finger in his ear and spits, touching his tongue, then utters the word "Ephphatha! ("Be opened") Immediately, the man can hear and speak clearly. When listening to this reading, I often focus on the man's hearing. But Jesus also cured the man's speech impediment, which I think indicates we're not supposed to just hear God's word, we are to speak to it, and speak of it. Once we allow Jesus to open our ears and hearts to the Good News, sharing it will begin to come naturally. There may still be times when our Catholic tongues feel tied, but "Be strong, fear not!" Jesus will give us the words.

ACTIONS Next time you take a drive, listen to the day's Scripture readings. Ask Jesus to open your ears and hearts to his words and show you how best to share them with others. And most teachers would agree: The more senses we engage, the more we take in. If you have trouble following the readings at Mass, open your missalette and read along silently.
