
Our Lady of the Black Hills exists to proclaim the joy of the Gospel to all creation and to transform lives with the Father's mercy. Last two Sundays, provided us with an opportunity to reflect on and answer two questions: Who do you say that Jesus is for you and in your life, and who do I say that I am in my relationship with Christ. How I see and understand Christ will reflect on how and where I see myself in Christ. Many words, behaviors and actions we express will testify to what is going in our life, what are we struggling with and what are our passions. After all, it is not what comes to us makes us unclean but what comes out of us, is what makes us clean or unclean.

A few weeks ago, as we celebrated our parish feast day, it was a very nice weekend. A good number of people have come to share in the festivities and in the meal. Thank you all who have helped in preparing and executing all the details of music and liturgy, especially the Knights of Columbus for the meal and some help with the Eucharistic procession. I am looking forward to another celebration at the Fall Festival. Attention to many details is important, and not to miss any integral aspects, the involvement of many is necessary.

The Holy Spirit is given to us to work with the grace of God and to share the fruits of that grace in our life. What is amazing is that sometimes what we think is not what God desires for us. What we want is not what the Holy Spirit is equipping us for. In our parish, we are blessed with the work that was done in the years past. Many of you have been involved in a variety of the ministries, pilot programs and new ideas. The call to stewardship in our diocese, parish and in our personal lives is very important, as it allows us to see the Holy Spirit at work. If you investigate our Parish Leadership Booklet, or into our parish website (www.OLBH.org), you will discover many amazing details. More than that, you will discover many ways that you can actively work with the grace of God and with the Holy Spirit. Yes, some of you will say "I have done it" "I worked on it already" "I do not have time" ...etc. However, as we look at the readings and the Gospel over the last few weeks, we will find Jesus who is inviting us to an active participation. We will not find there, words like for example - if you have already done it, or that you should only do this for one year, or only if it is convenient or good for you – these do not really go along with the words of Christ. The disciples were excited. because they saw how important their cooperation with Christ is, how powerful the Holy Spirit is, as they carried out their ministry.

Yes, some of us can become tired of carrying the cross, but not because it was too much, but rather because there was a lock of response from those who were invited to share the journey. I invite you to look up the description of ministry of the lector, extra ordinary ministers of the Holy Eucharist, altar servers, sacristans, hospitality, and greeters. I invite you to explore different groups that are active in the parish and in a wider community beyond the liturgical ministries. It is very important that we respond to the Holy Spirit and that we remain active. In a parish of some 500 registered families, we should only reflect on what else can we do, rather than, how do we convince someone to join us. You have the power; the Holy Spirit is waiting, and God is sharing the blessings and is in charge. Pray for each other and let me know, how I can be of assistance, or just call the parish office.

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Today's graphic Gospel passage always sounds a bit jarring: "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off." Upon first reading that passage, our response might be, "What?" But upon further reflection, it strikes me that Jesus is challenging us to attend to what causes us to sin: the vices we have acquired, the temptations we do not ignore, the sinful thoughts and behaviors we entertain or in which we engage. It is also important to identify where we might be culpable in leading others astray. In all of this, Jesus is asking us to be honest with ourselves and to take the necessary steps to "cut" out of our lives the things that lead us away from the Lord, allowing us to move toward him. Lest we get discouraged, we need only remember that we are not alone: We belong to Christ whose word is truth, whose precepts "give joy to the heart," and who tells us "whoever is not against us is for us." Like Moses in the first reading, we can ask that the Spirit descend upon us and give us strength.

### GO EVANGELIZE

### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Amazing feats we see on TV or read in the news can't help but capture our imagination. Our rich Catholic faith can be a little like that: just take a look at the lives of the saints. That's why I find the other passage in today's Gospel so encouraging. Jesus reminds us that even the smallest things we do matter — actions to help others grow in their faith: "Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward." As the Lord's spirit moves us to be a prophet to others – that is, to perform deeds in his name (mighty or not-so-mighty) – we have the ability to witness the Gospel of Jesus Christ in very real and concrete ways. As St. Teresa of Avila said: "Accustom yourself continually to make many acts of love, for they enkindle and melt the soul."

**ACTIONS** Prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation by asking Jesus to help you identify what causes you to sin or drives a wedge between you and others or between you and God. Then participate in this beautiful sacrament and pray for the grace to make changes.
