#### Jubilation from John

This Sunday, eleven of our children will receive Communion for the first time (they join two others who received at Easter Vigil and another who will receive later in California). First Communion Sunday always reminds me of Msgr. Arthur Doyle (†1994) who was the pastor of OLBH when our oldest daughter was a First Communicant. Although it has been 30 years, I still recall the little jingle that Msgr. Doyle taught all First Communicants: It looks like bread, it tastes like bread, but it isn't bread. It is the Body of Christ.

At a second-grade level, Msgr. Doyle's jingle clearly expressed what the Church teaches and believes: "In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, *the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially* contained'" (*CCC* 1374). But as St. Thomas Aquinas said, the Real Presence of Christ under the appearance of bread and wine is something that "cannot be apprehended by the senses, but *only by faith*, which relies on divine authority" (*CCC* 1381).

These statements from the *Catechism* definitively and unequivocally profess what you and I as Catholics should believe. However, a recent Pew survey revealed that only one-third of U.S. Catholics agree with this central teaching. Possibly the widespread doubt in the Eucharistic miracle stems from an understanding that has remained at the level of a second-grade jingle—an emphasis on "what" with little comprehension of "why."

A more mature understanding of the Mass reveals not only "what" the bread and wine become, but also "why" the Real Presence of Christ is absolutely essential. "The Mass is at the same time, and inseparably, the sacrificial memorial in which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated and the sacred banquet of communion with the Lord's body and blood" (*CCC* 1382). These dual dimensions of the Mass cannot be approached, much less attained without the body and blood, soul and divinity of Christ being substantially present under the appearance of bread and wine.

Just as Jesus sacrificed himself on the cross to the Father in atonement for sin, so we continue to offer him to the Father in the bloodless sacrifice of the Mass for our redemption. Indeed, one of the fruits of receiving Holy Communion is "cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins" (*CCC* 1393). The Lord spoke plainly about the necessity of receiving and communing with his body and blood: "Truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:53-54). These words would ring hollow for you and me and be ineffectual without his Real Presence in the sacred banquet of communion.

This Sunday, as we celebrate our children's first reception of Holy Communion, may each of us accept with child-like faith "what" we are invited to receive: the body and blood, soul and divinity of the Risen Christ—and may we come to more fully appreciate "why" his Real Presence is essential: as a sacrificial offering to the Father and as the sacred food necessary for eternal life.

# A Novena to the Holy Spirit for Our Confirmation Candidates Gabby Burress, Taylor Harrelson, Neveah Heid, Merrik Foster, Paige Phillips, Leighton Scherr

The idea of a 'novena' – nine days of prayer – began with the time period between Jesus' Ascension and Pentecost. In that time, the disciples were in hiding, out of fear, trying to figure out what to do next, but also gathered in prayer. The coming of the Holy Spirit, as the Lord had promised, on the tenth day, answered their questions. Filled with the power of the Spirit and given its gifts, they began to witness to the Lord's death and resurrection far and near.

Since Confirmation will be celebrated on May 14, we begin this novena of praying for our Confirmation candidates on May 6.

#### Begin each day with this prayer:

O Holy Spirit, Divine Consoler! I adore you as my True God. I give you praise with the angels and saints. I offer you my whole heart, and give you thanks for all you have given me. You shower your gifts on all the faithful. I ask you to visit our Confirmation candidates with your grace and love as they prepare to be sealed with your power at Confirmation. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

#### Continue with the prayer of the appropriate day.

Day 1 (May 6) Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth. Give our Confirmation candidates wisdom that your will may be clear to them and that they may accept it. Grant them the gift of counsel that they may always perceive what is right. Strengthen them that they may always be capable of fulfilling your will. May you reconcile all divisions in their friendships and families, among nations, and in your Church. May the gift of knowledge help them work for reconciliation and peace. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 2 (May 7) O Holy Spirit, make our Confirmation candidates faithful in every thought, and grant that they may always listen to your voice, and watch for your light, and follow your gracious inspirations. Come, Holy Spirit, shine on them with the radiance of your love. May you help them to rejoice in the countless blessings God has given them and teach them to do God's will. May your wisdom guide them, us, and all God's people. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 3 (May 8) You have called our Confirmation candidates to be members of the church, the body of Christ, and to be temples of the Holy Spirit. I ask you to give them these gifts: wisdom to seek you, understanding and knowledge of you, counsel to recognize you, the strength and the faith to hold fast to you, and awe that they might honor you. Make them true disciples of Christ, who was anointed by the Spirit to bring us Good News. May they act with justice, see Christ in the face of the poor and pray for those who mourn. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 4 (May 9) Loving God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you instructed the hearts of the faithful. Give our Confirmation candidates, by the light of the same Holy Spirit, a love for what is right and just. May the Holy Spirit fill their hearts with love for you and respect all your creation. Give them the gift of reverence for you and all that you have made. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 5 (May 10) Come, O Spirit of holiness, from the glory of heaven and send forth the radiance of your light. Father of all the poor, light and peace of all hearts, come with your countless gifts. May your gift of understanding enlighten our Confirmation candidates to grasp better Christ's love for them and show them how to love others as he loves them. May they show their love by serving our brothers and sisters. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 6 (May 11) Gracious God, I ask you to send the Holy Spirit, as you have promised. May your Spirit remind our Confirmation candidates when they forget you and the path you set before them. May the Spirit help them to remember your goodness, your wisdom and your unfailing mercy. Give them a new heart and place your Spirit within them. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 7 (May 12) Come, Holy Spirit, creator of all things: come visit the hearts of our Confirmation candidates with your power. Fill the hearts you created with your grace. You are the source of life, light and love, and all that is good. Join us all together as your sons and daughters. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 8 (May 13) O Holy Spirit, life and light of the Church, give our Confirmation candidates thoughts higher than their own thoughts, and prayers better than their own prayers, and powers beyond their own powers, that they may love and live, imitating Jesus Christ, their Lord and Savior, May the gifts of wonder and awe enable them to reject sin, and may the Spirit of the Lord live in them as his temples. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Day 9 (May 14) Holy Spirit, grant our Confirmation candidates sight to see the wondrous promise of your love, insight to see their own weakness, and the grace to ask for your help and mercy. As they come to their Confirmation, may they be filled with zeal to proclaim the Gospel in joy and strength. Come, O Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.
