“Brothers and sisters, You have forgotten the exhortation addressed to you as children: "My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him; for whom the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges." Endure your trials as "discipline".

(Hebrews 12:5-7)

In different steps (this year we focus on the diocesan level), we continue the celebration of the Eucharistic Revival in our country, diocese and in our lives. With God's grace we pray for renewed sense of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. We also continue to develop (to refresh) a better understanding of the Mass. In the first reading this weekend, God gathers all the nations to his holy mountain, in the second reading, we are reminded of the urgency to hear God's call. Those who hear the call of Jesus and respond to it will be saved. In the Gospel we hear of Jesus who discipline us to bring us into a deeper union with Him, and we must accept this discipline.

This weekend, during our Year of the Eucharist, we focus on three dimensions of the celebration of the Mass. In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah paints a vision of all people gathering together on God's holy mountain. This is God's deep desire. Jesus was the perfection of that invitation for us to be in God's presence now imperfectly, and perfectly in heaven. In the Gospel, there is an urgency to our response lest we be lost. There is a discipline we must be ready and willing to engage in so as to come into this deeper union with God in the Christ. The Eucharist is our way into this union with God.

At the heart of the Eucharist is our understanding that God is truly present there with us. God desires to be with us. The whole scriptures reveal this truth. God become present to us in Jesus, his Son. Jesus left us the Eucharist in which He is truly present to us, and where Christ is present, the Father is present as well. Eucharist is God's way of being constantly present with us, offering us the gift of salvation. We are invited to enter the Eucharistic celebration by joining ourselves to Jesus the Son. Jesus offered his life to God the Father on Calvary and He continues, in the eternal communion of love, to offer himself to God the Father. When we gather at Mass, we join the Christ in offering himself to God the Father. We join His redemptive sacrifice. It is redemptive because through Jesus' sacrifice to the Father, the Father accepts us in our sacrifice. We enter the life of God as we share in the communion of love and we are redeemed and saved.

The sacrifice of Christ is received by the Father. In receiving his Son, God the Father receives us. We receive life back along with Christ, and we are raised up. We share in the spiritual nourishment that God desires for us as we receive the Holy Communion. The Holy Communion is union with God the Father. God gives us his life back as he gives life to his Son. We are strengthened to continue Christ's work in the world, to be Christ-present to one another. All three of these aspects of the Eucharist are essential to our conscious participation. All three are important dimensions of our encounter with Christ.

WHAT IS COR AD COR?

The Cor ad Cor Spirituality Year is a weekly small group gathering of all men or all women to learn more about the spiritual life, to grow in relationship and conversation with the Lord, and to share faith and the work of the Lord with others.

Essentially, **Cor ad Cor is a retreat**, which begins with the Oremus program from Ascension Press (8 weeks), and then moves into the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola according to the 19th annotation (additional 22 weeks). Small groups of about six people meet weekly with a trained leader for these 30 weeks. In the Oremus program, Fr. Mark Touns teaches some of the basics of prayer and the spiritual life and gives direction for prayer and journaling. Small groups gather each week to learn and to talk about the life of prayer and what the Lord is doing in them. As Cor ad Cor continues with the Spiritual Exercises according to the 19th annotation, group members follow the direction for daily prayer given by St. Ignatius and come to the group to continue to discuss their prayer from the week and to learn more about the Rules of Discernment of St. Ignatius that help guide retreatants to hear God clearly.

Feast of the Transfiguration

Hi Fr. Andrzej and parishioners of Our Lady of the Black Hills in Piedmont!

Greetings from St. Bernard Catholic Church in McLaughlin. Just want to thank you once again for your parish's abundant gift to us of \$12,600.--! I will deposit your check in our Lakota Ministries account that we use in various ways to keep things up and running here at the parish in McLaughlin. As warm as things have been here so far this summer, I'm betting you'll be contributing in part to our electrical bill for our three churches. As you also know, gas prices have been at a historic high and we depend on our cars to travel to outlying churches and responsibilities to our parishioners. It seems like a little but these things add up.

You have been so faithful in your generosity to us in years past as well. How blessed we are to have such support. This lifts me up personally, especially when things seem to go rather slowly here. The Lord is indeed at work amongst His people as the Gospel is being spread. We thrive on thanking Him for the "little things" that He points out to us. Thankfully, His ways are not our ways (*Isaiah 55:8*) and are higher than the heavens above us. And that His word will not return to the heavens from which it came until it accomplishes what He's sent it for (*Isaiah 55:10-11*).

Just a small story I'd like to share with you. We usually drive down to Rock Creek/Bullhead community once a week apart from usual Sunday Mass – which usually draws about 10-15 people. We had our Eucharistic Revival adoration event this week. For an hour, we sat in the presence of the Lord Jesus, enshrined within the beautiful gold St. Katharine Ann Drexel monstrance that is making its round throughout the diocese right now. Our usual two faithful weekly adoration and rosary attendees came. But due to the special Revival event, a young woman came who is new to the parish. It was beautiful to see how engaged she was with Our Lord. She'd brought a neighbor's child with her as well and proudly told me before we began that she felt called to bring someone along with her. Later during adoration and during Sr. Jacque's beautiful reflection that focused on growing in appreciation of the Presence of Jesus, four additional neighborhood children showed up. Having never really spent much time in Church, much less being accustomed to extended quiet, they noisily settled down in a pew beside me. The five of us later went up and knelt (crowding three to a small *prie-dieu*) before Our Lord. We eventually got around to praying for their grandparents. I prayed that something would stick in their childhood memories for later. Maybe they'll return again because of our kindness or out of curiosity? Maybe they'll make their first Communion someday? They often come because there might be food after Mass. A small triumph. A seed Jesus said will grow into the largest of bushes that the birds of the air will build their nests in. (*Lk 13:19*)

God bless your families, your Pastor and your generous ways.
