"the coming of the Lord is at hand"

Jas 5:8c

Imagine you lived at the time of the early church, shortly after Jesus' resurrection and ascension into heaven. What was life like? What were the early leaders of the Church telling you? Imagine being so full of joyful anticipation for the return of Jesus, you sold everything you had and gave it to the early Christian community you joined. At that time, many of the Christians believed Jesus would return soon, very soon. And in the year 2022, we are still waiting. As I prayed with the scriptures before the Blessed Sacrament during adoration, I somewhat chuckled when 2 Peter 3:8 came to mind, "with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day." So, for God, it might only be a couple days since Jesus walked on the earth.

The season of Advent is a time of preparation, preparing for the coming of Jesus. While we most commonly think about celebrating his incarnation, his taking on human form and coming as a baby in the past, it is also about his coming again in the future. And just as a child is filled with excitement, hardly able to wait for the coming of Christmas and the gifts to be received, or parents in joyful anticipation of the birth of a child, we too should look forward with just as much excitement and joyful anticipation of the second coming of Jesus.

The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. It comes from the first word in the Entrance Antiphon, which is rarely heard in most parishes, comes from Philippians 4:5, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." In other words, we are to rejoice. Unfortunately, in our world, being joyful at this time of the year can be difficult. For some, this will be the first Christmas season after the death of a loved one. For others, they are dealing with health issues, or one of many other things. And with shopping and baking and parties to attend, it can be an exhausting time. But the Church wants to remind us we are to be filled with excitement and joyful anticipation.

So, over these final two full weeks of the Advent Season, spend some time in joyful expectation of Jesus' second coming. Take some time to talk to Jesus. Take a break from the worries and cares of the world, to spend at least a few minutes in adoration or before the Blessed Sacrament, reading scripture, visiting friends and family, enjoying a treat or two. Allow yourself an opportunity to experience a foretaste of the joy God is planning for us in eternal life. In other words, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice."


