Blessed are you...

Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours.

Are you poor? I'm not talking about economically poor. Maybe a better way to ask the question is "Are you lucky enough to not be addicted to material things?" Bishop Robert Barron said, "One of the classic substitutes for God is material wealth, the accumulating of 'things." These "things" could be money, houses, cars, or even drugs. When we accumulate these things, initially they can give us enjoyment, a "rush," but eventually the thrill wears off and you need more money, a better house, a newer car, or more drugs. And none of these material things will go with us when we die.

Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh.

This might seem a bit odd, to be talking about being blessed to weep. Another way to say this is "Are you fortunate to be able to display outward signs of anxiety, depression, or grief?" In other words, are you lucky enough you are not addicted to good feelings? So much in this world wants to make us always be happy, attempts to deny or medicate depression or sadness. How often when we are sad or hurting, and we are asked "How are you?" do we respond with "Good." when it is not true? This "feeling happy" is just as much a false god as money or power. There is only one source of true happiness, and that is from God. By getting to know God, we will find true happiness. And this happiness we can experience with God in this life, can be taken with use into eternal life.

Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man.

Why should we want to be hated, how is that a blessing? Does it change your thinking if it is stated as "How lucky you are if you are not addicted to the approval of others." Status, attention, and fame are some of the most powerful false gods who lure us. As Jesus Christ himself, and many saints, experienced, when you are not addicted to these things, instead you focus on the truths of God, you will be hated, excluded, insulted, and denounced. By focusing on God's truth, you will win true approval, from God.

Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

When you detach yourself from material things, from good feelings, and approval of others, it is then when can experience true freedom, true happiness, true approval. As Saint John of the Cross stated, "To reach satisfaction in all, desire satisfaction in nothing; to come to possess all, desire the possession of nothing; to arrive at being all, desire to be nothing." When we are addicted to nothing, it provides space for God to fill us with His blessings.

Jer 17:5-8 | 1 Cor 15:12, 16-20 | Lk 6:17, 20-26




Luke's account of the Beatitudes pulls no punches. Blessed are you ... who are poor, hungry, weeping, when people hate you. These admonitions bear little resemblance to the pursuit of happiness as most of us know it: Striving for wealth (or at least stability), enjoying a good meal, sharing a laugh with friends, and being well-liked. These are things of this world, and Jesus tells us that pursuing them alone will not make us truly happy. I don't think that means we need to wear sack-cloth and ashes, or refuse to enjoy the great gifts with which God has endowed his Creation. However, Jesus' words remind us that we won't find lasting happiness even in the finest meal or the most lavish vacation, but rather in placing our lives in God's hands. For the desire for happiness "is of divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart in order to draw us to the One who alone can fulfill it." (ccc 1718)



PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

It's a little ironic that I am writing a reflection entitled "GROW and GO." Few plants have survived my black thumb. That's why I love the image of the tree in the reading from Jeremiah. One who trusts in the Lord "is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream; it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit." These words from Jeremiah are a prophecy of hope, and hope allows us to accompany one another through the hills and valleys (and occasional dead plants) of our lives. We can become a source of hope to others by praying for and with one another and encouraging them on their own journeys of faith. In doing so, we help one another tap into the ultimate source of hope – the God who loves us.

STUDY Read the Beatitudes and the Sermon on the Mount and reflect on how Jesus' teachings draw us ever more to himself and highlight our baptismal vocation: holiness. What one thing can you bring to prayer and the sacrament of reconciliation this week to purify your heart?
