Jubilation from John

A couple weeks ago, as we entered into this period of Ordinary Time before Lent, I encouraged you to discover the extraordinary in the ordinary. I invited you to take a moment each day to ask yourself, "When did I experience Christ's presence today? Where have I seen Christ's love today? Who has been Christ for me today?" This time period before Lent calls you and me to grow with Christ and be transformed by him in the everyday, ordinary ways that his love is manifested in our everyday, ordinary lives.

This Sunday's Gospel reading certainly manifests how Jesus Christ can transform the ordinary into the extraordinary. Peter, Andrew, James, and John. They weren't rabbis, teachers, or priests. They probably weren't eloquent in speech, refined in manner, or educated beyond their trade. They were quite ordinary, simple fishermen—men who made their living by the sweat of their brow and their knowledge of an often fickle, sometimes terrifying sea.

Yet these smelly fishermen were called to be the first—and in the end—the foremost of Jesus' disciples. Why? I think what set them apart from the crowd—and often from us—is simply that *they heard the Call*. They recognized the extraordinary in the ordinary. What was so extraordinary? First of all, why would professional fishermen listen to and obey a carpenter's son? Clearly, this stranger on the seashore didn't have a clue about their profession because he told them to put out into the deep and cast their nets *in broad daylight!* The night was for fishing; the day was for sorting the catch and getting it to market! And yet, they did his bidding—they recognized an authority in the carpenter's call beyond their years of fishing experience—and their ordinary lives were transformed by an extraordinary catch of fish. *They not only heard the call; they also responded to it.*

Each of this Sunday's readings presents a clear and dramatic image of God's call, and the response of complete commitment that the call brings forth. Isaiah tells us of God's call to him to be a prophet, despite his unworthiness. Yet by the extraordinary grace of God, he is cleansed, and Isaiah ultimately and eagerly responds, "Here I am; send me!" (Is 6:8). St. Paul tells us of God's call to him to be an apostle, even though he was a persecutor of God's church. Yet by the extraordinary favor of God to him, Paul commits himself completely to the work that God calls him to do. Despite their lack of worth and their sinful nature, the Galilean fishermen heard God's call in the midst of their daily work—and they left their boats and their ordinary lives behind to follow Jesus.

In these three scripture readings, the grace of God transformed the ordinary into the extraordinary—the unworthy into the prophet, the persecutor into the apostle, the fishermen into fishers of men. But they had to cooperate in that change. They had to move out of their comfort zones and respond to the call of God. As we encounter Christ's love and presence in the ordinary, everyday moments of our lives, the challenge for us is to not only recognize the call, but to also respond to it—and to allow God's grace to transform us according to his plan for each of us.
