Our Lady of the Black Hills exists to proclaim the joy of the Gospel to all creation and to transform lives with the Father's mercy. "Brothers and sisters: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is

given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit;

to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues.

But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes."

(1 Cor 12: 4-11)

In the last few weeks, especially during Christmas time, I have reflected on my own vocation. I have been searching for the new sign, or better to say, for new affirmation, that I am still able to respond to God's invitation as a priest. This affirmation is sometimes visible and very much present, yet, at the same time, worries of this world tend to darken and hide the beautiful reality of God's affirmation. I have spent time on worrying about the needs of the diocese and of the parish that can benefit many ministries in the diocese and in the parish.

For the last few months, our Bishop has been working on the Diocesan Strategic Plan, which will impact the future of the Rapid City Diocese and all our parishes. The Strategic Plan will give us some new answers and provide new possibilities for our faith communities to be better equipped and more responsible in the use of the gifts God is giving us.

Looking at the Gospel this weekend we are reaffirmed that through the gift of faith we remain faithful to the grace and the life of God within us received in the sacraments. For this reason, the total trust in God's unconditional faithfulness to his promise is accompanied in the Church by the grave responsibility to cooperate in the action of God who calls, and to contribute toward creating and preserving the conditions in which the good seed, sown by God, can take root and bring forth abundant fruit. A call to prayer through which we can discover our vocation, is a sacred opportunity to discover the way Jesus leads us into the Father's house. Throughout the ages, the Church has been providing variety of ways to nurture our call to prayer and faithfulness in Jesus Christ.

St. John Paul II would however remind me of the words "Be not afraid." How sweet is the encouragement that I find in these words. And how important it is for me now to realize that the grace needed for the growth of seed is present all over us as we live in the Spirit. The moments of affirmation, the joy of the innocence, the strength in sacraments and peace in forgiveness, just to name few.

You are always with me as I cling to Jesus' Sacred Heart. Fr. Andrzej.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It was several years ago now, but the scene is still vivid in my mind. My son stood confidently in front of the altar as the music rose in a crescendo and his bride stepped into sight. The love and joy he felt trickled down his cheek as she walked down the aisle. He broke into a smile as she joined him, and proudly took her hand to promise to become one with her forever. Isaiah writes: "As a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you," Isajah was talking about the nation of Israel. but God loves and rejoices in each of his children and wants us to know the joy of being loved by him. He generously shares his gifts with us, "different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit," St. Paul explains to the Corinthians. All spiritual gifts come from God, and all are important and necessary: "To each individual, the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." God's gifts are distributed uniquely to each person to use in our own unique way to "announce his salvation, day after day," and invite others to discover the joy of his great love.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

You are a masterpiece! This message was conveyed at the camp our diocese held each year to help teens recognize that they are God's beloved sons and daughters, called and gifted by the Holy Spirit to be missionary disciples. Discerning what our gifts are and how to use them can be challenging. The Gospel about the wedding at Cana offers an interesting guide. Mary tells the waiters, "Do whatever he tells you." By reserving time for listening and not speaking during prayer, we can hear what Jesus is "telling" us. Jesus then says to the waiters, "Fill the jars with water." We can "fill our jars" with the knowledge of how to live as disciples by reflecting on Scripture. Finally, Jesus tells the waiters, "Draw some out." We can "draw" on his love for strength and courage when we need it, but more importantly, we are called to "draw some out" to share with others. In sharing the "good wine," the Good News of Jesus Christ, others will begin to believe in him, too.

PRAYER As the new year gets under way, devote time to discerning the unique spiritual gifts, or charisms, you have been given. Make time for silent prayer and reflecting on Scripture each day.
