Dear Friends in Christ,

I was wandering if anybody else has ever said or done something that was just, let's say inadequate to the situation. One of those moments that before you even finish, you already know, you have "goofed". I am not sure about you, but I sure have done plenty of it. Sometimes I can recover from that experience, sometimes I get laughed at, and sometimes I just need to find a way to make the situation right again.

I think that was the experience Abraham and Sarah had as they laughed at their guests, who informed them they will be parents in their old age. That was the experience Martha had when Jesus replied to her concern about Mary. That is true with many of us. We make plans, have dreams, create strategies and then.... After a while we find out, we goofed. But can we go wrong with God?

I like to think here of the new ways we can find direction in our life. I think that special attention to the detail was Martha's great asset and quality. We could almost say, that at first Martha is a responsible one and Mary is a free-spirited person. But Jesus shows us that even in chaos, there is order, even when things are going wrong, good is present there.

As I recall some of those silly, irresponsible, sad and confused moments I participated in, I cannot help but to laugh. Only this time I need to laugh at myself, realizing that God was even there. "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things." Lk 10:41

Two weeks ago, we read in the Gospel of the disciples being sent out on a mission, last week we read about how this mission could look like for us, and this week we are simply reminded where we can find the source to recharge. Or perhaps in today's world of technology, how we can reboot our programming. God is there to help and guide us. We make plans, but if they do not go the way we wanted, just smile and find a moment to sit at Jesus' feet.

The 2nd town hall meeting for the Diocesan Strategic Plan will present the demographics of the Diocese and OLBH as well as the predicted growth.


We need your INPUT to determine our needs at OLBH and the needs of the diocese and all of the faithful to aid the strategic planning process.


Holy Native Men and Women Mass

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Are you a Martha or a Mary? For me, it depends on the day, but on first glance I'd say I relate more to Martha. When I plug in the vacuum and start handing out cleaning supplies, one of my sons invariably asks: "Is company coming over?" Even once they arrive, I'm often so busy with host duties that I don't really relax enough to truly connect with our guests! All of that said, I'm not sure Jesus is criticizing Martha or just talking about housework; rather, he addresses her as a friend. "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing." Mary, who sits at the feet of Jesus, shows us what matters most; our relationship with Jesus. It doesn't mean we won't get caught up in the busyness of entertaining or life in general. When that happens, however, Jesus' words can gently call us back to what matters: the way we live our life for Christ each day and prioritizing our relationship with him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

It's wedding season! I was recently talking to a friend whose daughter got married a few weeks ago. She and her daughter had spent months planning the wedding, of course, but the actual day went by "too fast," she said, her voice tinged with regret. Sometimes it seems life can be like that. We can get so caught up in the day-to-day that we forget to take a breath and savor each moment with friends and family. In today's readings, Mary shows us how to truly be present to Jesus by listening to his voice in prayer and reading his words in Scripture. Martha teaches us how to open our homes and our hearts through hospitality. We can learn from both of their examples, drawing strength from prayer and extending the peace of Jesus to others through hospitality and our everyday interactions.
