# For the sake of the ten, he replied, I will not destroy it.

Gn 18:32c

Last week's first reading from Genesis, we heard how the Lord appeared as three men to Abraham and revealed to him how his wife Sarah was to have a child in the next year. This child was to become a great and mighty nation and do what is right and just, becoming key in God's plan for the salvation of humans. As the Abraham walked briefly with them as they were heading to Sodom and Gomorrah, it was revealed to Abraham, they were headed there to see if those towns should be destroyed because the people were not following God's plan and doing things against God's will.

In today's first reading, we hear the story with Abraham asking if they would "*sweep away the innocent with the guilty*?" Abraham went through a whole series of numbers, starting with 50, all the way down to 10. In the end, the Lord replied, "*For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it.*"

Next weekend, after the Saturday 5:00 PM and between the Sunday 8:00 and 11:00 AM Masses, the parish will be holding townhall meetings. Your participation in this meeting is critical and all are strongly encouraged to attend one of the two meetings. Part of what will be shared are various statistics, about the Church, and specifically about our parish. From a 2021 research report on the Catholic Church in the United States from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA), it shows the number of Catholics associated with parishes has declined, the number of people who report they are Catholic to decline, the number of priests, religious sisters and brothers declined. The one exception is the number of Permanent Deacons has increased slightly.

These smaller numbers will have an impact on the Catholic Church in the United States, in our Diocese, and on our parish. While our parish may be doing well in many aspects, there is always room for improvement, and the Church needs your ideas and suggestions. And the Church, which includes all of us, need prayers. As we hear in the Gospel reading, Jesus taught us to pray. And Jesus encouraged us to be persistent in our prayer, in our requests to the Father. This week, spend time specifically praying for the Holy Spirit to reveal to you, what you are to share at the townhall meetings. Be persistent in your prayer for the Holy Spirit to guide the Church as we go through these challenging times. And ask the Father to help you be counted among the right and the just, with Abraham.

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I miss my friend, Carol, a second mother to many of us navigating young adulthood in one of my adopted hometowns. Carol offered wisdom and perspective – and binders full of recipes for any occasion. So, even after moving away, I knew that I could "Dial A Cook" at a moment's notice and Carol would drop everything and patiently dictate a recipe. Today's Gospel fills me with gratitude for Carol, who through her love and generosity hints at God's love and generosity toward us. Carol is with God now, so I still talk to her from time to time. Today's Gospel reminds us that, likewise, we can bring anything to our loving God in prayer, and the Father will listen and respond. We may think we can power through our days, and our lives, on our own, but Jesus reminds us to persist in prayer: "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find."

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Remember the time before smartphones? When you needed a cup of flour or an egg, that meant knocking on a neighbor's door. Now we most often text ahead, making the request a bit less awkward. Well, despite the proliferation of Catholic and spiritual apps, praying still requires "putting ourselves out there" before God. While God knows all and sees all, it us up to us to bring our deepest needs and desires to him. Our smartphones can help us here: We can set a reminder to pray each morning and each evening. We can model our persistence in prayer to our children and others by praying with and for them, especially at times when they are struggling with something or facing a difficult choice or situation. If an earthly Mother or Father knows how to give good gifts to their children, after all, "how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

**PRAY** Recite the Lord's Prayer, understanding that God knows our needs and will give us each our daily bread.
