Jubilation from John

Earlier this month, Joni and I took a ten-day road trip with our seven- and five-year-old granddaughters, Aurora and Kayde. We went east to northern Iowa for a family reunion, then south to Branson, Missouri, for Silver Dollar City, and back north to South Dakota for my step-mother's $100^{\rm th}$ birthday celebration. As a farmer's son, I always enjoy seeing farm country from ground level, gazing to the left and right, wondering at the height of the corn and the golden fields of grain.

Maybe it's the engineer in me, but one thing that always gets my attention these days is the multitude and humungous size of the grain bins, not only in cooperatives and terminals but also in yards of individual farmers. And yet despite their awe-inspiring number and size, right next to the monstrous bins are often conical piles of golden grain dumped on the ground from towering elevators. Such overflowing bounty makes the parable in this Sunday's Gospel come to life. I always wonder why the farmer is storing so much grain—waiting for higher prices, future famine, or empty railcars? I know it's not because the farmer is just resting, eating and drinking, and making merry because I can see yet another crop maturing in the surrounding fields.

This Sunday's parable challenges all of us, whether farmers or not, to ask why am I building bigger bins—or larger garages or fatter bank accounts? Jesus does not condemn prosperity and possessions, but he asks you and me to look at our underlying motivations. Do I seek "more" for the sake of more? Do I own my possessions or do they (and their payments) own me? Do I work to provide a livelihood—or do I live only to work? This Sunday's reading from Ecclesiastes says that concern for material possessions is vanity, utter futility. Jesus reinforces this wisdom when he admonishes the crowd: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions" (Lk 12:15).

In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul provides the proper motivation for our earthly work and the antidote to greed, the vanity of vanities: "If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth" (Col 3:1-2). When we follow St. Paul's sage counsel, we focus on the source of our blessings, and we recognize that our greatest possession can never be earned by our best efforts nor stored in buildings bigger than our hearts. Greed is overcome by gratitude, and hearts hardened by selfishness are softened by an attitude of stewardship. Whatever earthly prosperity we enjoy and whatever material possessions we own become gifts not to be stored but to be nurtured, shared, and returned with increase for the glory of God. With this attitude of stewardship, you and I can rest, eat and drink, and be merry with the peaceful assurance that we are indeed rich—rich in what matters to God.







GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Is it me, or does every popular waiting-room magazine feature an article on "how to declutter" in six easy steps? I always read those first, then add them to the unsightly pile of magazines on the end table. The constant, if futile, quest to declutter comes from a deeper place than a desire for a clean house. It feels so liberating to let go of those things that we no longer need. Today's readings challenge us to look not just outward, but inward, at what distracts us from what really matters. Paul exhorts us to "seek what is above," letting go of earthly concerns or habits that get in the way of our relationship with God. By putting on a "new self" through prayer, the sacrament of reconciliation and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, we will become "rich in what matters to God."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Personal-finance writers often divide people into two camps: Savers or spenders. I'm definitely a saver! I dutifully contribute to my 401K, stash unexpected windfalls into my savings account, and carefully budget. On the rare occasions when I go out to dinner, I struggle with choosing what to order: It's a high-stakes decision! Fiscal responsibility is a good thing, but today's parable challenges me to be just as diligent about investing in my relationship with God, my family, and the people I encounter. We are blessed with so many opportunities to "seek what is above": It may mean spending the first 30 minutes of the day in prayer, reading books or articles that help us grow spiritually, or joining a parish Bible study. Or even taking a friend to dinner and picking up the tab! In doing so, we are investing in this life – and the next.

ACTION Take a look around your house and donate items in good condition to a charity in your community. And then ask the organization if they need any help with a summer yard cleanup or simple tasks around the facility - these are easy ways to involve the whole family in serving others.
