Jubilation from John

What makes Christianity unique among all the religions of the world is that the Supreme Being whom we worship revealed himself to humanity personally. Before we ever chose him, God created us out of pure love and chose to love us intimately. This unique relationship is grounded in our Jewish roots and was first revealed to Abraham, the father of Judaism. Beginning in Chapter 12 of the Book of Genesis, we eavesdrop upon intimate conversations between the Lord God and Abraham. In this Sunday's first reading from Genesis 15, we are privy to the Lord God speaking directly to Abraham—choosing him to be the father of a great nation with descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky, promising him a rich and verdant land to settle and populate, and sealing that covenant in smoke and fire with a sacrifice offered in faith by Abraham.

In the Transfiguration, we are witnesses to the ultimate fulfillment of this covenantal relationship—the word of God made flesh and dwelling among his people. In a dazzling display of the Lord God's love for his people, Jesus Christ is brilliantly transfigured, and his ultimate glory is briefly manifested to his awestruck disciples. From a cloud, God speaks once again to man and the singular identity of Jesus is revealed: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him" (Lk 9:35). The great prophet Elijah and the great lawgiver Moses fade into the mists. Jesus stands alone as the Only Begotten Son—the voice of God not in a cloud but in the flesh—and his followers are commanded to listen!

Where is the voice of God in your life today? The days of Abraham are long past, but the unique relationship that he enjoyed with the Lord God remains. God has chosen you and me—and invites us into an intimate, personal relationship with him through his Only Begotten Son. Are you listening to him? Each morning of Lent, I begin the Liturgy of Hours with the verse: "Today if you hear the voice of Lord, harden not your hearts" (Heb 3:15). The verse causes me to wonder if the Lord is speaking to me, but my heart is too hard to hear. Where is his voice? Am I deaf or just not listening?

Clearly the voice of God speaks to the heart, not to the ears. As I have reflected upon Fr. Andrzej's Lenten homilies on the moral conscience, I have discovered that the conscience is "the heart" through which the Lord's voice is heard. When I opened the *Catechism* to the section noted by Fr. Andrzej last Sunday, I found these words: "His conscience is man's most secret core and his sanctuary. There he is alone with God whose voice echoes in his depths... When he listens to his conscience, the prudent man can hear God speaking" (CCC 1776, 1777). During this Lenten season, you and I are challenged to soften our hearts—to form and reform our consciences—so that the voice of God speaks to us more clearly, more distinctly, ever calling us to love and to do what is good and to avoid what is evil.

Keep the Faith!

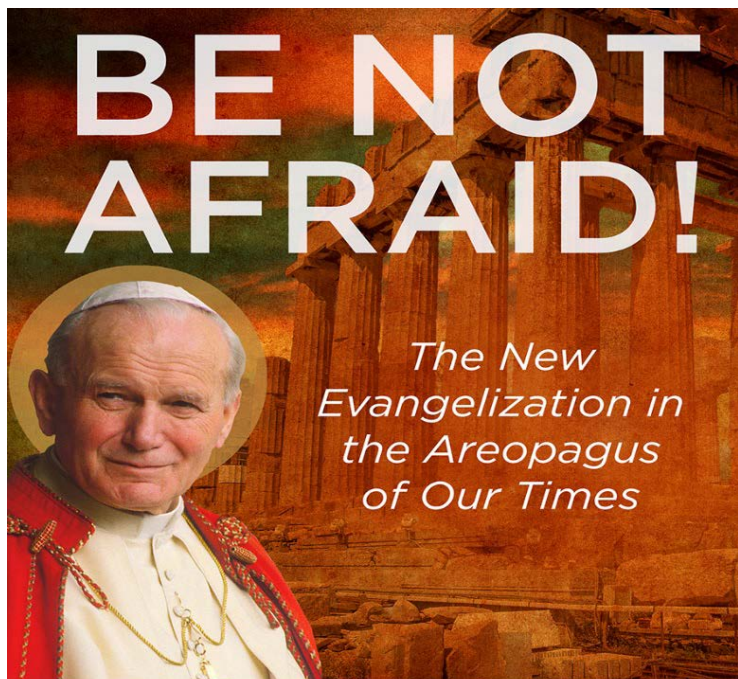

Second Sunday of Lent

Gn 15:5-12, 17-18 | Phil 3:17—4:1 or Phil 3:20—4:1 |
Lk 9:28b-36

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's Gospel from Luke, Jesus is transfigured before the disciples: They see a glorious vision of him wearing dazzling white, with a "face changed in appearance," and conversing with Moses and Elijah about the "exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." This is in marked contrast to what Luke had recounted just prior to these verses: Jesus' prediction of his suffering and death, and the assertion that his disciples must take up their crosses daily in order to follow him. So it is no surprise that Peter, likely somewhat stunned after being a part of both moments, "did not know what he was saying." Then a cloud passes over and, while they are frightened, they hear God's voice affirm what they have just seen: "This my chosen Son; listen to him." We all experience these extremes – days where all seems lost; others where we feel as though we've had glimpses of heaven. Today's Gospel encourages us to look to Jesus, who has experienced the frailty of humanity and the glory of divinity. Through his suffering, death, and resurrection, we are redeemed, and ultimately – as the disciples glimpsed today – "he will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Life can bring unexpected joys and disappointments. One day we celebrate a birth; another we grieve the loss of a loved one. We fall in love; we experience broken relationships. Many of us may find ourselves in flux much of the time: Will this pandemic ever end? Will the cancer recur? What's next now that the kids are grown? Today's readings give me great hope in the knowledge that God is with us through all the twists and turns and ups and downs of our lives. Just as God fulfilled his promises to Abraham, God has given us a Savior in Jesus Christ and promises that we will someday share in his glory. To that end, we can strive to ensure that no darkness in our world prevents us from becoming a source of light to others. Jesus and the saints walk before us. We pray, then, for the grace to listen to God's chosen Son, and to "stand firm in the Lord."

PRAY Lent is a good time to try a new form of prayer. Do you often pray silently? Try the rosary or spoken prayer. Do you normally pray out loud? Try centering prayer or another form of quiet or silent prayer, such as *Lectio Divina*.
