**"Go and teach all nations, says the Lord; I am
with you always, until the end of the world."**

(Mt 28:19-20)

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, we read of Jesus' rising and ascending into his glory. It is our hope that as we are united with Christ into his Passion and Death, that we also will one day rise with him into new life. We ask however how will we rise, what happens to us when we die, and when this rising will take place? These are just few questions that come to our mind when we deal with the death and resurrection. The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives good answers:

"What is "rising"? In death, the separation of the soul from the body, the human body decays and the soul goes to meet God, while awaiting its reunion with its glorified body. God, in his almighty power, will definitively grant incorruptible life to our bodies by reuniting them with our souls, through the power of Jesus' Resurrection." CCC # 997

"Who will rise? All the dead will rise, "those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment." CCC # 998

"How? Christ is raised with his own body: "See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself"; but he did not return to an earthly life. So, in him, "all of them will rise again with their own bodies which they now bear," but Christ "will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body," into a "spiritual body" CCC # 999

"This "how" exceeds our imagination and understanding; it is accessible only to faith. Yet our participation in the Eucharist already gives us a foretaste of Christ's transfiguration of our bodies: just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection" CCC # 1000

Searching for the perfection in our body, let us not forget that the true beauty is hidden in our hearts, where God lives. Let us also remember that our body is not just something that we need only for a while, we will need it later as well, so let us take diligent care of it and in a respectable way, reflecting the life of God in it, even when this body gives us reasons to doubt in goodness of God.

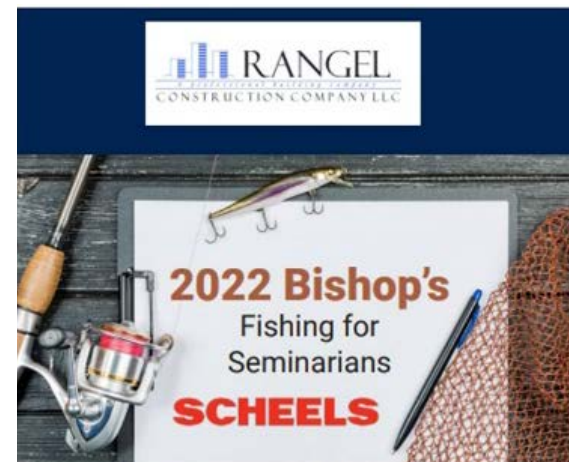

Fr. Krebs grew up in New England. He earned a B.S. in engineering from North Dakota State University and he attended seminary in St. Paul, Minn., and was ordained a priest for the Catholic Diocese of Bismarck on July 7, 1978. He served in Dickinson, Mott and New Leipzig, before spending two and a half years in Kenya where he celebrated Mass in the Swahili language. Upon his return to the Diocese of Bismarck, he served in Kenmare, Hettinger, Reeder, Scranton, Linton, Hazelton, Braddock, St. Mary's in Bismarck, and Our Lady of Grace in Minot. He retired in 2021.
